#### **GRASS ORDINANCE**

Grass may not be taller than 6 inches by City Ordinance. Tall grass and/or weeds spreading seeds are declared a nuisance.

#### **HOUSE NUMBERS**

Addresses must be clearly visible from the street.

#### NOISE

Lyndhurst Ordinances prohibit noise that disturbs the peace. Noise complaints are given greater consideration before 7 a.m. and after 9 p.m.

#### **PARKING BAN**

No parking is permitted on City streets between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m.

#### **POWER OUTAGES**

Please report and outage directly to CEI at 888.544.4877, not to the Police Department or City Hall.

#### **HOLIDAYS**

On the following observed Holidays there will be NO Rubbish or Recycling pick-up: Labor Day - September 4 Thanksgiving Day - Nov. 23

If your collection day falls on one of these your pick-up will be the next day. Please have your rubbish and recycling out by 7 a.m. trash day. Containers must be removed the same day!

#### YARD WASTE

All grass clippings, hedge trimmings and garden plants must be placed in paper Yard Waste bags or designated containers. Yard Waste in plastic bags WILL NOT BE COLLECTED! Also see the Leaf Collection notice in this issue!

#### **WEEKEND RUBBISH**

From April until the weekend of November 18 and 19.

Rubbish and yard debris may be dropped off at the Lyndhurst Service Garage on Saturdays and Sundays from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

This service is for RESIDENTS ONLY – proof of residency is required.

#### **PAPER SHREDDING**

The Fall Shredding Day will be Saturday, October 21 from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the City Hall Parking Lot. FOOD DONATIONS WILL BE COLLECTED AT THIS EVENT

#### **COMPUTER RECYCLING**

Place your old Computer or other peripherals next to your recycling container on collection day to be picked up and recycled or bring to the Service Department Monday to Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. or to weekend collection.

#### **Lyndhurst Community Center**

Our Lyndhurst Community Center is available for use by community organizations, businesses with their principal base in Lyndhurst and for our residents for private events. There are six rooms available to accommodate events large or small.

If you have not yet visited our Community Center, please stop by for a tour (appointments preferred at 440.449.5011). Our regular hours are Monday to Friday 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

We do collect old cell phones (iPods-iPads-MP3 players and digital cameras, too) to be recycled for donation to the American Cancer Society.

# From the Fire House



ach year, our staff visits the over 800 fire hydrants in the City to assure every fire hydrant functions properly and to complete routine maintenance. Our maintenance program meets the specifications of the American Water Works, Cleveland Water and the Insurance Services Organization (ISO) standards. Hydrants found damaged or out of service are reported to Cleveland Water for repair or replacement.

Once again, during Lyndhurst Home Day, the

Lyndhurst Firefighters Local 1676 will be staffing the Beer Tent in the park during the entirety of the festival. Partial proceeds support various charities including Aluminum Cans for Burned Children (www.acbcohio. org) and Olvia's Dream (www.oliviasdream.org). Please stop by the tent and meet your local firefighters and support the local charities!

Lastly, a friendly reminder and some cautions, as the evenings become cooler, that:

- 1. All open burning requires a permit and approval from the Fire Department.
- 2. Yard waste, including fallen leaves are not permitted to be burned at any time.
- 3. Outdoor recreational fires must be in an approved fire pit or container with smoke not creating a nuisance.

Also be sure to get your wood-burning fireplace cleaned and inspected prior to use by a certified chimney service company. Be sure to dispose of any ashes in a lidded metal container located outside and at least 5 feet away from your home or garage.

# From the desk of Patrick A. Rhode, Chief of Police

ecently, Lyndhurst Police Sgts. Tim Eliopoulos and Joe Romano successfully completed North Coast Polytechnic Institute's Police Executive and Administrative Leadership School (PEALS). PEALS is a three-week police management training program designed to enhance the operational and conceptual leadership skills of current and future leaders within the law enforcement community. Their successful completion of this program is part of an ongoing process within our agency to assure firstline and mid-level supervisors have access to high quality training. Sqt. Romano was promoted to Patrol Sergeant in September 2021 and Sqt. Eliopoulos was promoted to Patrol Sergeant in April 2022.

During the three-week course of study, Sgts. Eliopoulos and Romano studied topics such as human resource management, labor relations, discipline, contract negotiations, administrative investigations, community policing, core values, training and organizational viability, CALEA, personal financial planning, civil liability, administrative law issues, law enforcement in the 21st Century, managing change in organizations, strategic vision and planning, leadership and ethics, search and seizure, professional stops, racial profiling, and managing and motivating a diverse employee population. The training program is designed to combine substantive lecture presentations with practical synergistic exercises and problemsolving project work so that students are better equipped to confront the present and future issues critical to law enforcement managers and executives. An extensive amount of material was covered!

I am proud to announce that both Sqt. Eliopoulos and Sgt. Romano both attained accumulative grade averages of well over 90% during their course of study. Their successful completion of this program clearly demonstrates their commitment to our Community and their profession that will only benefit the Lyndhurst Police Department and all we serve. We look forward to seeing the continued contributions both sergeants will make to further LPD's vision and mission in service to the community. I know they will approach every situation equipped with new tools in their toolbox.

#### **Protect Your Mail**

Mail thieves have been extremely busy as of late. There has been a surge in postal thefts, from collection boxes - not only nationally and regionally, but locally as well. The vast majority of letters and packages reach their intended destination intact, but there are thieves targeting our mail. There are extra steps you can take to ensure your mail arrives safely at its destination.

Follow and share these tips to help protect yourself and others against mail and package theft:

- Use the letter slots inside the post office for your mail or hand it to a letter carrier.
- Empty your mailbox promptly. Don't leave mail in your mailbox overnight. If you are expecting checks, credit cards, or other negotiable items and will not be at home, ask a trusted friend or neighbor to pick up your mail.
- If you do not receive a check or other valuable mail that you're expecting, contact the issuing agency immediately.
- · If you change your address, immediately notify your post office and anyone with whom you do business via the mail.
- · Do not send cash in the mail.
- Tell your post office when you will be out of town so they can hold your mail until you return.
- Report all suspected mail theft to a postal inspector.
- Consider starting a neighborhood watch program. By exchanging work and vacation schedules with trusted friends and neighbors, you can watch each other's mailboxes (as well as homes).
- · Consult your local postmaster for the most upto-date regulations on mailboxes, including the availability of locked centralized or curbside mailboxes.
- Sign up for "Informed Delivery" at www.USPS.com. This is a great service that provides daily email notifications of incoming mail and packages.

If you believe you see a mail thief at work, or believe your mail was stolen, call Police immediately, and then call Postal Inspectors at 1.877.876.2455. Visit the U.S. Postal Inspection Service on the web at www.uspis.gov.


#### **SEL Schools Enhancing Playgrounds** at Elementary Buildings

Members of our community will soon begin to see the fruits of planning and preparing for brand new, state-of-the-art, ADA accessible playground equipment at our elementary buildings. Allocating approximately \$140,000 per unit, the playgrounds at Adrian, Rowland, and Sunview will be systematically replaced with new, innovative apparatuses, which help to stimulate the play-to-learn concept of education during recess. Our PTAs have also played a considerable role helping to raise supplemental funds for these playgrounds, and the SEL Schools is excited to be making the approximately \$420,000 investment.


# It was "State-of-the-Art" back then...

he original Lyndhurst Pool, built in 1955, stands ready for winter as the park undergoes renovation in 1957. The two original playgrounds, then a rudimentary version, and the pavilion, are hidden in the woods surrounding the area. Lyndhurst Village Hall is at the top left, directly across from Lyndhurst Presbyterian Church. The path through the park covered the Lyndhurst Creek, a branch of the Euclid Creek, where flooding was an occasional problem. Especially bad in the basement jails at the village hall, this became a driving factor to build our new Lyndhurst Municipal Center, which was accomplished in 1974.

Mayor's note: Over the years, as our community has matured, Lyndhurst has seen many additions and improvements to our recreation, our Municipal Center, Safety and Service facilities. Our historian's photograph shows the footprint of our original Lyndhurst Pool and a much more open park without the tennis courts, Community Center, and Service Garage buildings. We have leveraged use of our Lyndhurst Park area to include a beautiful new pool, expanded and improved playground area and newly resurfaced tennis/ pickleball courts. We have also improved the use of our Brainard Park facilities by transforming the former pool into a beautiful spray-ground and adding the fitness walk and other amenities. There are options for everyone in our parks!

While enjoying the pool with my Granddaughter, I mentioned to her that I was present at both openings; the original pool (as shown) in 1955, and the present Lyndhurst Pool opening in 2003! It brought to mind this photo, taken September 29, 1957 and one of my personal favorites. Enjoy!

# Police and Fire Dedication Playground

he latest addition to our Lyndhurst Park is the new Police & Fire Dedication Playground area which recently opened to honor our first responders and all the hard work they do to keep our community safe.

The expanded space and new features focus on Police- and Fire-themed equipment that is both ADA compliant and inclusive. The objective of this specific improvement was to provide a dedicated space where a true community relationship can be fostered, beginning with our youngest residents and their families. Police Chief Patrick Rhode advocated for this expansion of Community Greenspace from day one. "Our goal for this park is to provide visibility in a fun interactive space. Encouraging youth to recognize police personnel as important allies invested in their safety and well-being," said Rhode.

The need for purposeful dialogue between Police and Fire personnel and the community prompted Mayor Ward and Finance Accountant Melissa DiGeronimo to bring this to life. With federal funding support provided by the Cuyahoga County Development Block Grant and the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, the Police and Fire Dedication playground took about six months to design and install. Partnering with Gametime Playground Services we were able to custom design a fully funded dedication park for around \$200,000.00.

As Lyndhurst continues to build upon its vision of vibrant, welcoming city parks, we are reminded of how important spaces like this are to a community. "The Fire Department is always in support of anything that enhances physical and mental well-being. Community parks have proven time and time again to be a valuable

# From our Service Department

# Yard Waste & Leaf Disposal

his is a friendly reminder that our YARD WASTE is only collected when in Brown Craft Paper Bags or from designated YARD WASTE containers. Yard Waste materials in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected! Longer branches can be stacked on the tree lawn to be chipped. Please only place your branch trimmings or yard waste containers out the evening before your scheduled collection!

The leaves are still green but that will change! Beginning in mid to late October the Service Department will begin vacuuming piles of leaves from treelawns as we do every year. Leaf pick-up will be on an AS-NEEDED Basis. All leaves that are collected from treelawns will be recycled, composted, and made into leaf humus or other product. It is extremely

important that all leaves are piled on your treelawn for vacuum pick-up. Please DO NOT pile leaves in the street or gutter as this is a safety hazard and these leaves may not be picked up. PILED LEAVES MIXED WITH BRANCHES OR OTHER MATERIALS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP!

At the end of the leaf season, should you have small quantities of leaves or other yard waste for pick-up, please place them in paper yard waste bags or your designated yard waste container for pick-up on your regular collection day. We appreciate your assistance in assuring a successful leaf collection program and the responsible recycling of as much or our yard waste as possible.

#### Your Tree Lawn Tree

ur recent inspection of tree lawn trees indicates that some trees are suffering from too much attention! Some trees have a deep edge created around the root zones to keep the grass contained around the tree. The soils of tree root zones are often also cultivated. The result might be attractive but can also be disastrous for the trees. Many of the trees' fine feeding roots have been damaged or cut resulting in poor nutrient and water uptake. This translates into poor growth rates, increased insect and disease problems, and, frequently, the death of the tree.

We have also found some mulch has been applied over the tree root zones. This is an excellent maintenance practice when properly applied. What frequently happens is that mulch is over applied, and the tree suffers. Some have mulch forming a 'volcano' or 'teepee' around the trunk of the tree causing the root collar

flare to be buried. The rule of thumb for mulch is to apply no more than 2" of aged, shredded bark mulch at any one time. If you feel that more is needed in the future, we recommend the old mulch be gently cultivated and then new mulch be applied, taking care not to apply mulch against the tree trunk. The mulch against tree trunks keeps the bark tissue wet and rot develops.

Finally, during the dry summer months, trees need additional water. We recommend that you water your trees thoroughly (a young tree needs about 15 gallons of water every seven to 10 days). The tree's root zone should then be allowed to dry out before watering.

Remember, a tree is a "thing of beauty." We hope that your tree will grow to become even more beautiful. It should if you follow these simple maintenance suggestions.
