WORLD EVENTS NORTH KOREA'S MISSILE

On Friday, February 5, North Korea finished fueling a longdistance missile, and it was launched on Super Bowl Sunday at 10:00 am Pacific Time. The U.S National Guard observed this process of the fueling and preparing of this long-distance missile on February 4.



A senior defense official from the U.S. said that the North Korean missile was headed toward space, and that it was not a threat to our nation. If the United States military thinks that our country is threatened, the U.S Navy has a missile destroyer fitted with the latest defense technology. This latest defense technology can successfully shoot down the missile. Furthermore, South Korea is constructing their own defense technology with the help of the United States.

Although our country was not threatened, some U.S defense officials do not yet have the



knowledge of whether this missile launch was a satellite or a nuclear missile. Most U.S military members have inferred that this missile was a nuclearwar headed missile. This missile had a range of 5,600 miles.

Japan observed the missile and reported what happened afterwards. According to Japan, parts of the missile landed in four parts of the world. The first location was 150 kilometers south of the Korean peninsula. The second and third locations were east of Korea, in the East China sea. The final site where part of the missile landed was south of Korea in the Pacific Ocean, about 2,000 kilometers down.



Did you hear the news? The African Grey Parrot is disappearing from the forest! They're disappearing because the African Grey Parrot has a high demand as pets, so smugglers make illegal trades at the Uganda border, according to a 2016 study published in Ibis, a magazine about birds. Sadly, this has been happening from 1990 through today, according to the National Geographic Magazine. African Grey Parrots used to be a common sight in West and Central Africa.



According to the study over, 800,000 birds were legal traded since 1980. In 1992 trade was banned so smugglers started trading the birds. They have to capture many because most die in captivity. And,according to BirdLife International, in the past 20 years more than one million birds have gone missing from the forest.

Even though the African Grey Parrot is disappearing, there is still a way we can help as a community to prevent them from disappearing. One way we could help is by preventing forest loss. Another way we could help the Parrots is by asking the other governments to ban and catch smugglers making illegal trades at the Uganda Border. Finally, before you purchase any pet, make sure it has the right documents to prove it has been breed in captivity and not smuggled.




