#### DAKOTA DREAMS TUTORING PROGRAM

1. Dakota Dreams Online Tutoring returns, with new feature for grades 1-8

Sometimes, a student just needs a little extra time and attention to master particular concepts or skills. Last year, the Board of Regents and Department of Education launched the <u>Dakota Dreams Online Tutoring Program</u> to provide that support. Students K-12 were able to access FREE after-school homework help from tutors who were students training to be teachers at Northern State University and Black Hills State University.

The Online Tutoring program will be back again in school year 2023-24, with an added feature called Tutor Tracks. A toolkit for communicating with parents will be provided to principals soon. Please think about sharing information regarding this FREE service with your families (at open houses, via e-newsletters, school websites, etc.)

The basic Online Tutoring program makes tutors available seven days a week, at no cost. Tutors can be accessed on-demand or via pre-scheduled sessions. The new Tutor Tracks will be seven-week, curriculum-based sessions designed to help elementary and middle school students build skills in the areas of reading, grammar, and math. Like the basic program, Tutor Tracks will be led by teachers in training, and the sessions will be free.

#### **Tutor Tracks**

- Parents register their students for Tutor Tracks (application opens Aug. 1 on OurDakotaDreams.com)
- Students meet with their tutor 2x per week over 7 weeks
- First term includes two session options:
  - Sept. 11 through Oct. 27, 2023 (reading and grammar available)
  - Oct. 30 through Dec. 15, 2023 (reading, grammar and math available)
- Reading lessons will be offered to 1st-8th grade students
- Grammar lessons will be offered to 3rd-8th grade students
- Math lessons will be offered to 3rd-8th grade students

### VISIT THE ELEMENTARY GYM DURING THE GREET YOUR TEACHER NIGHT

We will have a Back to School backdrop for you to take a picture of your child/children to remember the occasion!

All of the paperwork that needs to filled out, such as Free/Reduced Lunch forms, medical forms, etc. will be in the Gym instead of each classroom.

If you don't make it to Greet Your Teacher Night, we will have the paperwork available at the Elementary Office.

We will have the backdrop available for the KS/K students when they come to their individual sessions on August 17th and 18th.

#### FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH FORMS

Our school receives more funding through federal programs and we greatly benefit when the number of families on Free and Reduced meals increases. Even if you think you may not qualify, please fill out the paperwork. Remember, the paperwork can be filled out at any point during the school year if your family/employment circumstances change. Our business manager, Sara Gates, will be available during the Open House and will be in her office to assist families and answer questions. The information submitted is confidential, and we truly appreciate your time in filling out the paperwork!

#### SCHOOL BREAKFAST

Breakfast is available for students to eat from 8:00-8:20 each day. Students go to their classrooms at 8:20 AM to get organized, hear school announcements, and start their day! School menus are available on the school website under Elementary School/Calendar.

### KINDERSTART AND KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS' FIRST DAY OF CLASS IS MONDAY, AUGUST 21ST

Parents of KS and Kindergarten students-please watch the mailbox for information concerning your child's meeting time on either August 17th or 18th. You and your child will meet with your child's teacher at a specified time to bring school supplies, discuss classroom procedures, etc. Your child's first day of school will be Monday, August 21st.
