In third grade we have Evelyn who likes wrapping and opening presents.

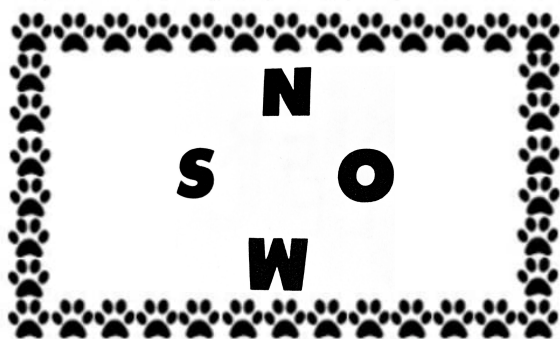
Cheyann, in fourth grade, said that she has a fake Christmas tree that they hang ornaments on.

### Directions:

- Step 8. Use a Sharpie to draw a mouth.
- Step 9. Braid yarn long enough to make it look like a scarf and put it between the two foam balls.
- Step 10. Use thumb tacks for the buttons on the snowman.
