This Month in History: Los Angeles Blew Up, 1910!

Who committed the crime of the century? On October 1,1910 at 1:07 a.m., John J. McNamara and James B. McNamara decided to destroy the Los Angeles Times Building because they wanted the union to have more strength. How did this happen? On the night of September 30, 1910, James McNamara left a suitcase full of explosives in an alley between the Times Building and the Annex known as Ink Alley. The explosives were left near flammable printer ink. He also left a suitcase near the Times publisher, Harrison Gray Otis' house. The bomb started a blaze that killed 21 newspaper employees and damaged 100 more.

Why Do Schools Have Solar Panels?



Girls from Afghanistan were originally banned after entering a U.S. robotics competition, but were later invited back in?! They had their Visas denied many times, but then President Trump personally approved them. Even though they had a rough start, they did well at the end!

The U.S. robotics competition is a competition where there are a lot of contestants who compete in battles with robots. Each year, a team of high school students, coaches, and helpers work during a 6-week period to build robots that can weigh up to 120 lbs. The robots have to complete tasks such as kicking balls into goals, flying discs into goals, placing inner tubes onto racks, hanging on lines, and balancing on beams.

This year, there were contestants from Afghanistan. They had a hard time getting to the robotics competition even before Trump's law came out that they couldn't come over to America. The reason for this is because, while Trump was running as a candidate for President, he indicated that they would not be allowed to come to the United States to participate. Right when Trump became President, and it was becoming a law, the robotics competition staff started taking in the contestants for the competition.

During the competition, a group of girls from war-torn countries, whose U.S. Visas were twice rejected, won silver medals for courageous achievement at the international robotics contest, with judges praising the group's can-do attitude. The first Global Challenge event in Washington ended in mid-July, having attracted teams of teenagers from more than 150 nations. But, all eyes were on the squad of girls from Afghanistan, who had twice traveled to the American embassy in Kabul only to have their Visa application turned down. They were finally granted entry after their story had gone viral, with just one week to go until the event began.

The girls were originally denied entry, but still did well. They received second place in the competition. Even though it was rough at the beginning, they did well at the end!!!

Instructions:

- 1. Start with 2 orange pipe cleaners and cross them to form an X.
- 2. Then repeat that same step with the other 2 orange pipe cleaners. Put the two X's together and twist in the middle.
- 3. Start putting on the beads.
- 4. Once you've finished putting on the beads, leave a space at the top and tie it.
- 5. When you tied the top, gather the ends of the orange pipe cleaners and bring them up to form a pumpkin shape. Tie the brown pipe cleaner around the top to look like the stem of the pumpkin.
- 6. When you've finished doing the stem, use the green pipe cleaner and wrap it around so it could look the vine of the pumpkin. Use a pencil to make the curls of the "vine" and you're done.
