The state Parliamentary
Procedure CDE was held on
Dec. 14, 2018 at Columbus
State Community College. The
Waterford FFA Chapter, located
in Washington County, took six
team members and one alternate
to compete in the Parliamentary
Procedure CDE. Those students

The team spent several months diligently practicing for the CDE. They met weekly before school started to share breakfast and learn about Roberts Rules of Order, constructive debates and how to properly run a meeting. And much to their surprise, their hard work won them a first place banner at the state CDE.

"We weren't expecting it," said Leeann Trippett, a senior member who has been involved with the parliamentary procedure team for three years. "When we won we were sort of in disbelief. Like, did we just hear the same thing?" Trippett said the team was surprised to have made it to the final round and didn't expect to walk away as the state champions.

Trippett loves to debate and be challenged to think outside the box — something she had to do during the CDE. She said she can now comfortably "speak and come up with something that's intelligent and truthful on the spot."

Trippett added that she's thankful for the skill set she gained from her years of using parliamentary procedure because they've helped prepare her for interviews and how to work effectively with others.

"We've had to learn how to be accountable for ourselves while still working as a team," Trippett said.

As a senior, Trippett has learned events like the Parliamentary Procedure CDE help FFA members build character and become positive contributing members of society.

Competing in the Parliamentary Procedure CDE is a tradition for the Waterford FFA Chapter. Every year, they send their chapter officer team to compete. This is the third year in the chapter's history that they've brought home a state-winning banner.

Katelyn Huck, a junior member of the team, agreed with her teammate. Hearing Waterford announced as the winner was a welcomed surprise.
