Dear Parent,

Beginning now until March 31, 2023, students, teachers and parents will have the opportunity to participate in the eleventh annual statewide Illinois 5Essentials Survey. Your students individual school will contact you about an optional opt out opportunity as schools will administer the test in different time frames. This survey is designed to generate a detailed picture of the inner workings of your child's school. As a parent, this opportunity will allow you to share your thoughts on the important elements of school effectiveness in a survey about your child's school.

On behalf of the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois 5Essentials Survey will be administered online by UChicago Impact at the University of Chicago. The survey gathers data related to five indicators that can predict important student outcomes including improved attendance and larger test score gains. These five indicators that affect and predict school success are:

- Effective Leadership
- Collaborative Teachers
- Involved Families
- Supportive Environments
- Ambitious Instruction

Prior research in more than 400 schools has shown that schools that were strong on at least three of these "5Essential" indicators were 10 times more likely to improve student learning gains in math and reading than those that were weak on three or more Essentials.

All teachers and 4th through 12th grade students will be responding to this survey. 5Essentials Reports will be generated for schools if their teachers and/or students meet the response rate threshold of 50 percent. These reports will be sent to the schools and districts in May and will also be included in the State School Report Card.

Additionally, your district has chosen to provide the optional Parent Supplement survey. If at least 20 percent of Orion parents complete this survey, a parent supplemental report will also be generated. The parent data will not be reported to the State Report Card.

Your participation in the parent portion of the survey will help us understand the conditions at your child's school and guide improvement. Your identity and survey responses will be kept completely confidential and will never be connected to you or your child.

The Illinois 5Essential Survey for students and teachers will be conducted from now through March 31, 2023. The Parent Survey Supplement will be conducted during the same timeframe. ## **School Board Election**

The School Board Election for Orion Community Unit School District #223 will be held on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. Five seats on the seven-member Board of Education will be filled at the April 4<sup>th</sup> election. One seat will serve a two-year (unexpired) term, expiring in 2025. Four seats will serve four-year terms expiring in April 2027. School board elections are nonpartisan and board candidates do not indicate a political party affiliation.

Membership of the Board of Education is restricted to a maximum of three members from any congressional township. The five seats with terms expiring in April 2023 are from the townships of Colona (2), Rural (2) and Western (1). On the basis of the existing board membership, members may be elected in the following numbers from each congressional township:

Not more than 3 may be elected from Lynn Township.

Not more than 1 may be elected from Western Township.

Not more than 3 may be elected from Andover Township.

Not more than 3 may be elected from Osco Township.

Not more than 3 may be elected from Colona Township.

Not more than 3 may be elected from Edford Township.

Not more than 3 may be elected from Rural Township.

Not more than 3 may be elected from Coal Valley I Township.

Candidates running for the four-year terms (four seats open) are Julie Abbott (Rural Township), Sonia Berg (Colona Township), Kimberly A. Nightingale (Rural Township), Jamee Sovey (Osco Township), Jonathan Stockton (Western Township), and Hayley Voorhees (Western Township). The candidate running for the unexpired two-year term is Amy Blommer (Colona Township).

#### WHEN TO KEEP SICK CHILDREN HOME FROM SCHOOL

Information compiled from CDC (Centers for Disease Control); DOH (Department of Health); OSPI (Office of Superintendant of Public Instruction)

Deciding when to keep a sick child at home from school is not always easy. It's important for children to attend school and for some parents staying home means missing work. But when a child is truly sick, they need to stay home in the care of an adult to get well and to prevent spreading illness to others.

Please keep the school office up to date with current phone numbers so you or an alternate contact can be reached if your child becomes ill or injured at school.

The following information may help you decide when to keep your child at home. "Child" refers to all school-aged children including adolescents. This information does not take the place of consulting a medical provider. See below for "When to contact a medical provider".

These are also COVID symptoms. If your child has these symptoms, please get tested.

**Sore Throat:** A child with a mild sore throat, no fever and otherwise feeling well may be fine to attend school.

When to Keep a Child Home from School: Keep a child at home and contact a medical provider for a severe sore throat and if white spots are seen in the back of the throat, with or without a fever.

**Strep Throat:** A significantly sore throat could be strep throat, a contagious illness. Other symptoms may include fever, white spots in the back of the throat, headache and upset stomach. Untreated strep throat can lead to serious complications.

When to Keep a Child Home from School: Keep your child home from school with the above symptoms and contact a medical provider. A child diagnosed with strep throat is no longer infectious and can return to school 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has been started.

#### Stomach Pain:

When to Keep a Child Home from School: Consult a medical provider and do not send a child to school with a stomach ache that is persistent or severe enough to limit activity. If vomiting or diarrhea occurs, keep the child home until symptom free for 24 hours.

## C. R. Hanna Elementary School News



The 2023 Kindergarten Round-Up will be held at C. R. Hanna Elementary School on:

#### Wednesday, March 15, 2023 - 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

During the event, parents/guardians will complete the necessary paperwork for students to enter kindergarten in the fall, distribution of important examination forms, collection of state birth certificates, proof of residency, and answering any questions that you may have concerning kindergarten. It is important that you attend Round-Up, as we use this information to compile our kindergarten class lists for the fall, which will not be available until after our school-wide registration in August.

To be eligible to enter kindergarten in the fall, a child must be **five years old on or before September 1, 2023.** Proof of birth must be presented at the time of registration. A certified birth certificate from the state or county office that the child was born in will be accepted. **A hospital certificate will not be accepted.** 

State law requires that each child entering school for the first time have the following documentation:

- 1. Physical examination with up-to-date immunizations
- 2. Dental examination
- 3. Vision examination by an ophthalmologist or optometrist

ALL parents of incoming kindergarten students will need to provide Proof of Residency. Please note even if you have older children in the Orion School District, you will be required to provide this information as well.

Here are a few examples of what the Proof of Residency form requires for new students:

Examples from Category 1 on the form (MUST PROVIDE 1)

Lease Agreement Mortgage Papers Tax Bill - most current

Examples from Category 2 on the form (MUST PROVIDE 2)

Driver's License Library Card Utility Bill with current address Vehicle Registration with current address



## **SAT Testing - Junior Students**

Orion High School will again be offering Juniors the opportunity to take full-length, practice SAT tests (including the essay if time permits). The next practice date is **Friday, March 17th at 10:00 a.m.** *It is highly recommended that students take at least one practice test.* 

On March 17th, junior students are invited to take a practice SAT in the OHS Library starting at 10:00 a.m. Students will be provided lunch that day and should expect to complete the practice SAT within 3-4 hours. A reminder email will be sent out and a sign-up sheet posted in Mr. Lister's room as we get closer to March 17th.

On average, a student shows a 100 point improvement on their SAT exam if they practice ahead of time <u>using</u> at least two practice tests. Not only will an improved score help with college admission, but it is likely to help a student secure additional financial assistance.

We hope all juniors take advantage of this free opportunity to help prepare for the real SAT on Wednesday, April 12th. Please let myself or Mrs. Bakener know if you have any questions concerning the SAT and we hope to have a great turnout for these practice days.
