Online Registration for 2023-2024 School Year - Online registration opens on Wednesday, July 5, 2023, for ALL returning students. Online registration will be **REQUIRED** for all returning students for the 2023-2024 school year. Preferably, you can complete this process from your own home; however, you may come to the District Office (beginning July 5 within the hours listed above) to complete the process if you do not have access to a computer with internet service. Please go to http://www.teacherease.com and log in to your child(ren)'s account to begin the process. (Please contact your child(ren)'s school or the District Office if you have not yet created your TeacherEase account.) Online registration will close at midnight on Friday, August 11, 2023.

ALL school fees may be paid online using your credit card. This includes registration fees, student lunches, athletic fees, etc. The District will credit the \$2.00 convenience fee for each payment of \$50.00 or more to your child's lunch account. If you prefer to pay school fees with cash and/or checks, please stop by the District Office at the office hours listed above. One check for ALL fees for all family members will be accepted! Bussing information will be completed through the online registration process (except for new students).



Completed physical and dental forms may be mailed to the School Nurse, P.O. Box 189, Orion, IL 61273; or dropped off at the District Office (open all summer), 1002 11th Avenue, Orion. Completed physical forms are required for all new students to the district, kindergarten students, 6th grade students and 9th grade students. Completed dental forms are required for all kindergarten, 2nd grade students, 6th grade students and 9th grade students. Physical and dental exams need to be completed and returned to the School Nurse by the first day of school (Tuesday, August 15, 2023).

Students who are new to the district may register on Wednesday, August 2, or Thursday, August 3, 2023. Please call the District Office (309-526-3388) during the month of July to make an appointment or call the appropriate school office in August to make an appointment.

News from the Nurse's Office

The Orion School District is offering sports physicals for the 2023-2024 school year.

The Cost: \$10.00 (cash)

The Place: Orion Middle School

The Time: 4:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. (first come, first serve)

The Date: Wednesday, August 2, 2023 (excluding 6th graders and incoming freshmen)

Students who would be interested: Any students entering grades 7, 8, 10, 11, or 12 who are planning to go out for a school sport including cheerleading and spirit squad. 6th and 9th graders **do not need a sports physical** as they will need a complete school physical for middle school or high school. Doctor **must** check **Interscholastic Sports** on bottom portion of the physical form. A **copy** is to be turned in to the Athletic Director.

If you have had your child's 6th or 9th grade physicals done early, you may have to have a sports physical done if they are going out for a sport at the end of the school year. Physicals are only good for 390 days.

NOTE: All sports physicals must be on the IHSA cards provided by the school. These will be available at both schools and <u>need to be filled out with parent's signature along with the attached questionnaire</u> **PRIOR to the sports physical.** Bring the required forms to the Middle School when getting the sports physical.

PARENTS: Please note the attached physician's form needs to be filled out entirely and signed before a physical will be given. The doctors will not complete a physical on your child if these forms are not filled out properly.

All physicals are good for 390 days from the date they are issued. This is an IHSA State Rule.

As A Reminder:

The students in the following grades for the school year 2023-2024 will need the appropriate forms turned into the office on the state of Illinois forms.

Preschool: Physical, immunizations, lead test/screening

Kindergarten: Physical, immunizations, dental, vision, and lead test/screening

2nd Grade: Dental

6th Grade: Physical, immunizations and dental 9th Grade: Physical, immunizations and dental

12th Grade: Updated immunizations

Physicals and immunizations are due on the first day of school or your child will be held out of school. We also recommend making a copy of your forms for your records.

If you are a new student coming to our district and have never attended an Illinois school before, you will be required to turn in a physical with immunization records, dental, and vision exam.

Seasonal Allergies and School Performance

For allergy sufferers, airborne allergens such as dust or pollen, in addition to side effects of medications used to treat these allergies, may cause fatigue, mood problems, change in focus, reduction in the speed and accuracy of problem solving, and poor reasoning. Allergies affect approximately one in five children. Daily pollen counts are available from the National Allergy Bureau of the Academy of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology.

We recommend that you encourage your children to shut off the video games and get plenty of exercise this summer. Try to join your children in exercise - you will be making memories and maybe even enjoy it!!!

Contact Information

Please make sure that your emergency contact is a reliable one with reliable phone numbers. Also, the contacts should be someone who is available to pick up your child if needed. If numbers should change, please contact the school and let us know.

Kids and Exercise

When most adults think about exercise, they imagine working out in the gym on a treadmill or lifting weights. But for kids, exercise means playing and being physically active. Kids exercise when they have gym class at school, during recess, at dance class or soccer practice, while riding bikes, or when playing tag.

The Many Benefits of Exercise

Everyone can benefit from regular exercise. Kids who are active will:

- have stronger muscles and bones
- have a leaner body because exercise helps control body fat
- be less likely to become overweight
- decrease the risk of developing type 2 diabetes
- possibly lower blood pressure and blood cholesterol levels
- have a better outlook on life

Besides enjoying the health benefits of regular exercise, kids who are physically fit sleep better and are better able to handle physical and emotional challenges — from running to catch a bus to studying for a test.

The Three Elements of Fitness

If you've ever watched kids on a playground, you've seen the three elements of fitness in action when they:

- 1. run away from the kid who's "it" (endurance)
- 2. cross the monkey bars (strength)
- 3. bend down to tie their shoes (**flexibility**)

Parents should encourage their kids to do a variety of activities so that they can work on all three elements.

Endurance is developed when kids regularly engage in aerobic activity. During aerobic exercise, the heart beats faster and a person breathes harder. When done regularly and for extended periods of time, aerobic activity strengthens the heart and improves the body's ability to deliver oxygen to all its cells.

Aerobic exercise can be fun for both adults and kids. Examples of aerobic activities include:

- basketball
- bicycling
- ice-skating
- inline skating
- soccer
- swimming
- tennis
- walking
- jogging
- running

Improving strength doesn't have to mean lifting weights. Although some kids benefit from weightlifting, it should be done under the supervision of an experienced adult who works with them.

But most kids don't need a formal weight-training program to be strong. Push-ups, stomach crunches, pull-ups, and other exercises help tone and strengthen muscles. Kids also incorporate strength activities in their play when they climb, do a handstand, or wrestle.

Stretching exercises help improve flexibility, allowing muscles and joints to bend and move easily through their full range of motion. Kids look for opportunities every day to stretch when they try to get a toy just out of reach, practice a split, or do a cartwheel.

The Sedentary Problem

The percentage of overweight and obese kids and teens has more than doubled in the past 30 years. Although many factors contribute to this epidemic, children are becoming more sedentary. In other words, they're sitting around a lot more than they used to.

According to the Kaiser Family Foundation, 8 to 18 year-olds watch about 4.5 hours of television a day. The average kid spends 7 hours on all screen media combined (TV, videos, and DVDs, computer time outside of schoolwork, and video games).

One of the best ways to get kids to be more active is to limit the amount of time spent in sedentary activities, especially watching TV or playing video games. The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends these limits on screen time:

- kids under age 2 should watch no TV at all
- kids older than 2 should be restricted to just 1-2 hours a day of quality programming

How Much Exercise Is Enough?

Parents should make sure that their kids get enough exercise. So, how much is enough? Kids and teens should get 60 minutes or more of physical activity daily.

The National Association for Sport and Physical Education (NASPE) offers these activity guidelines for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers:

Age	Minimum Daily Activity	Comments
Infant	No specific requirements	Physical activity should encourage motor development
Toddler	1½ hours	30 minutes planned physical activity AND 60 minutes unstructured physical activity (free play)
Preschooler	2 hours	60 minutes planned physical activity AND 60 minutes unstructured physical activity (free play)
School age	1 hour or more	Break up into bouts of 15 minutes or more

Infants and young children should not be inactive for prolonged periods of time - no more than 1 hour unless they're sleeping. School age children should not be inactive for periods longer than 2 hours.

Raising Fit Kids

Combining regular physical activity with a healthy diet is the key to a healthy lifestyle.

Here are some tips for raising fit kids:

- Help your kids participate in a variety of age-appropriate activities.
- Establish a regular schedule for physical activity.
- Incorporate activity into daily routines, such as taking the stairs instead of the elevator.
- Embrace a healthier lifestyle yourself, so you'll be a positive role model for your family.
- Keep it fun, so you can count on your kids to come back for more.

Early Childhood Screening - The Orion School District will hold an early childhood developmental screening on Monday, August 7, from 8:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. at C. R. Hanna Elementary School. This screening is for children living in the Orion School District that are 3 years old, but not yet in kindergarten.

Since children change and grow quickly, we strongly recommend that you take advantage of this opportunity as learning delays can be detected at a young age. Your child will be screened for speech, vision, hearing, large and small motor skills. This screening assessment is a developmental check-up for you and your child. It is encouraged that a parent or legal guardian accompanies the child to the screening. Registration forms must be filled out and signed by a parent in order for the child to be screened.

Please call the Orion School District Superintendent's Office at (309) 526-3388 anytime before August 1, 2023 to schedule your appointment.

<u>Backpack Night (First – Fifth)</u> - Mark your August calendars now for "Backpack Night"! On Monday, August 14, 2023 from 4:00 p.m.-6:00 p.m., the C. R. Hanna staff will host Backpack Night for all first through fifth grade students and their families.
