School Safety Message

Many of you know about the tragic events that occurred in Nashville earlier this month. It is an unfortunate reality in our society. At Logan Magnolia we do not take this reality lightly. Our school safety team works diligently to not only be highly informed but also to institute the best research-based practices. Logan Magnolia has been utilizing Standard Response Protocol (SRP) and the Standard Reunification Method (SRM) for almost a decade. A parent guide outlining these practices has been added below. We strongly encourage you to read through the information and/or learn more about the programs online at <https://iloveguys.org/#Hugs>. Additionally, we recommend that you discuss these practices with your students as appropriate.

Furthermore, our district practices protocols used in both SRP and SRM on a regular basis. We practice each of the protocols for SRP at a minimum once a semester and SRM once a year. We take the task of ensuring the safety of all of the students and staff in the district very seriously. Please reach out to your building principal if you have any further questions.

ISASP Testing Information

At the end of this month, students in grades 3-11 will be taking the 2023 Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress. This standardized test is mandated by the State of Iowa, and our school uses this data to make better-informed curricular decisions as well as to see how we compare among other schools in the state. Additionally, this data will show your child's academic progress and growth in the areas of Math, Reading, and English/Writing. The Science portion of the ISASP is only given to students in grades 5, 8, and 10. Test dates are as follows:

- Wednesday, April 5 (Math - Grades 3-11)
- Wednesday, April 12 (Reading - Grades 3-11)

To help your student do their best on testing days, please encourage them to get a good night's sleep the night before, eat a balanced breakfast, and have a positive mindset.

Junior High and High School students should take extra care to be sure their Chromebooks are fully charged each day for testing. Lastly, students with a cell phone or smartwatch will not be able to access these items during testing time.

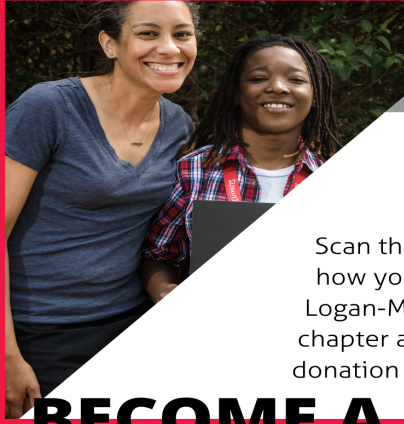
