



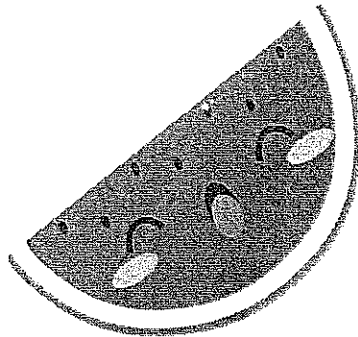
## South Elementary School Board Report May 15, 2019
