2. Discussion on Superintendent's Parent Advisory Council Kick-Off Meeting

Dr. Gilmore described the steps taken to inform parents of the Superintendent's Advisory Parent Council Kick-Off scheduled for Wednesday, February 29, 2012 at Swift Middle School.

Parents who participated in the Parent SEE and the How Welcoming is Your School Walk Through program were contacted. The promotional flyer was distributed widely and posted on the district's webpage. The flyer is also posted in area businesses and in school buildings.

A one page parent needs assessment will be distributed to assess parental interests and concerns. The presentation will also include a discussion of educational best practices currently underway in the district.

Dr. Gilmore reviewed a list of communication tools. (Attachment A)
