Hillsdale Preparatory School will use funds to make improvements to a building that houses several classrooms. By making these repairs, the classrooms will remain in use, which allows for small class sizes and social distancing to the extent possible, as recommended by the CDC.

This paraprofessional will collaborate with teachers to identify student areas of need, provide evidence-based interventions and monitor progress of student achievement.

Hillsdale Preparatory School will spend remaining funds to purchase books and other evidence based classroom materials that promote diversity and address student interest and provide on-going opportunities for students to have access to quality instruction in reading and math. Additionally, Hillsdale Preparatory School will use funds to provide teach retention bonuses in order to maintain continuity of services and progress on school improvement initiatives.

Please describe how the LEA will ensure that the interventions it implements, including but not limited to the interventions implemented under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act (see below) to address the academic impact of lost instructional time, will respond to the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students, and particularly those students disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, including students from low-income families, students of color, English learners, children with disabilities, students experiencing homelessness, children in foster care, and migratory students.
