Barton High School is located on 9546 Hwy 85 South, Lexa, AR 72355. Our phone number is 870-572-7294. Our web address is bartonsd.org. Barton High School has an enrollment of 313 students with an average class size of 12. The student to teacher ratio is 7:1. Teachers have an average of 10.16 years of experience. School student demographics consist of 55.5% white, 40.3% African-American, 1.5% Hispanic/Latino, 0.003% Native American, 1.2% Asian, and 1.2% Two or more races. Barton High School has 85% low-income and 100% participate in the free lunch program. 11% percent of our population is eligible to receive special education services.

Barton High School communicates with parents using the school website, teacher-parent communication logs via phone calls using the Mitel software, School Status, and email. Each year Barton High School reaches out to our parents through many sporting events, extra-curricular after-school activities, two parent-teacher conferences, band and choir concerts, open house, high school graduation festivities, and honor's assembly and other honor's banquets. Barton High School seeks input from all stakeholders by parent-teacher surveys and the parent-teacher engagement advisory committee.

Barton High School currently uses the Pearson Envision Math Curriculum and the pre- and post-assessments programs provided therein. i-Ready math software program was purchased for grades 7-8 to provide supplemental intervention. ALE, Credit Recovery, and SP-ED Grades 9-12 will supplement in math with Edmentum software.

Goal 3: Barton High School 11th graders will show improvement on their ACT scores, and movement towards college readiness as indicated by a score of 19 in the subjects of Math, English, and Reading on the ACT.

Action Statement: All Barton High School 11th grade students will enroll and complete the ACT Prep course provided by Cantrell and Waller Preparatory Services. The course includes three full Act tests, strategies for each subject, and step by step instructions for how to correctly answer each question on the ACT. Students will take all three tests and correct wrong answers in order to receive credit for the course.

Furthermore, each 11th grade student will receive ACT practice materials, and a fee waiver to take the December 2021 ACT, as additional practice and preparation for the February state ACT tests. Growth will be measured by comparing scores from the first practice ACT in September to the ACT scores in December. Areas of weakness will be identified and students will focus on those areas in preparation for the state ACT test February.

Our Leadership Team's progress in fully implementing Indicators and meeting Objectives:

Barton High School has selected indicators which will engage teachers in assessing and monitoring student mastery in ELA, math, and science with data from the NWEA Map Periodics. Each team member contributes to the decision-making process. There is a consistent attendance rate of above 90% for leadership meetings. We have selected several indicators to address our stated goal. However, the Leadership Team will continue to monitor and assess throughout the 2022 -23 school year and select new indicators as needed.
