

The New Jersey School Performance Report defines a chronically absent student as a student who is not present for 10% (18+ days) of the school year <u>for any reason</u>. The state's school attendance standard is 94%. As of April 30th, our student attendance is at 92.6%, which is 1.4% below the state's goal.
