
Sickness checklist:

Lesson Focus:

Kindergarten: Ourselves

Students practice personal economics by making wise choices.

1st: Neighborhood Economy

Students discover how families are alike and different and how they work together to create a strong economy for the neighborhood.

2nd: Communities

Students will learn about their community, and the way people in communities work, earn, and spend money, and help one another.

3rd: Saving & Spending

Students learn about the four choices with money (earn, spend, save, and donate) helps up reach our personal goals and dreams, and helps keep the places we live, like cities, towns, neighborhoods, or farms, alive and healthy.

4th: Be an Entrepreneur

Students explore well-known businesses, their origins, and the traits common to the entrepreneurs who started them.

5th: More Than Money

Students explore money-management skills and become familiar with the key differences among earning, saving, and spending.

6th: Economics for Success

Students make choices to better understand the concept of self-knowledge

– the awareness of their skills, interests,

and values – as they consider education, careers, and other life choices.
