## Principal's Message May 2nd Celebration of Learning

I want to encourage all parents to join the WHES staff on the evening of May 2nd for our **Celebration of Learning**. It is an opportunity for the school to showcase programs and activities that demonstrate the depth and diversity of learning that takes place every day. Students, grades PRE K - 8, will be able to assist parents in understanding the goals and processes that exist within the learning demonstrations and to, simply stated, celebrate the combined work of both students and staff. Our program will have three separate components that will be interactive and engaging:

- 5:30-6:00 PM Learning Within the Classroom This segment of our program will offer parents the opportunity to visit classrooms and see evidence of student work and programs they are participating in. Feel free to not only visit your child's classroom but other classrooms as well.
- 6:00-6:30 PM Experience the School Nutrition Program This is a first time effort by our School Nutrition Department to provide an opportunity to sample from a wide array of foods that are typically served to students. This "tasting" buffet will take place in our Gymacafetorium (WHES Gym) with nutrition staff available to answer questions. School lunch programs have evolved dramatically over the past few years and I encourage everyone to take advantage of this chance to experience this new culinary direction.
- 6:30-7:00 PM Restorative Practices at WHES The final segment of our celebration will take place in the gym and will focus on our Restorative Practices here at WHES. George Conant, our Restorative Practices consultant, will be joining us to provide parents with a brief overview of just what Restorative Practices are all about. He will follow that by running an interactive circle with some WHES students to demonstrate one of the key components to Restorative Practices. At the close of the program there will be an opportunity for parents to ask questions.

Our school slogan is: : "At WHES, We Have Pride Inside!" and I think, by participating in the WHES Celebration of Learning, you'll see ample evidence of the pride both students and staff have in their efforts and performance. I hope you all join us on the 2nd!

Students who are currently enrolled in an RSU 12 Pre-Kindergarten Program will not need to be screened because they have already participated in the screening process when they began Pre-Kindergarten.
