COPYRIGHT

COPYRIGHTED MATERIALS MUST BE DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE CONTENT STANDARDS BEING TAUGHT.

DIGITAL RESOURCES MUST BE ORIGINAL WORKS, LEGALLY CREATED, AND NOT PIRATED.

DIGITAL MATERIALS SHOULD BE LINKED TO THE ORIGINAL SOURCE AND NOT TO A SAVED COPY.

- Streaming from **PERSONAL** accounts is never acceptable.
- Substitutes should never show movies.
- The most common infrigement of copyright is the use of licensed characters, such as Disney and Harry Potter.
- Read-alouds can be recorded and posted in passwordor code-protected digital platforms, but they should be deleted promptly.
- Consumables, such as workbooks, should not be copied and shared.
- Most Teachers Pay Teachers products are limited to single teacher use and should not be shared.
- Portions of textbooks can be digitized for remote or virtual students, as long as physical copies exist in the classroom.
- Portions of purchased class sets can be digitized and posted on digital platforms as they are being taught in class. Books should never be posted in their entirety, and posted portions should be removed promptly.
