



Shelby County Career Technical Educational Center 2021-22 School Improvement Plan At-a-Glance

The Career Technical Educational Center (CTEC) offers eleven different career technical programs that aim for students to become college and career ready. Students are selected through an application process to become trainees. Once selected, the students participate in a simulated workplace environment that prepares them for the world of work. Students have the opportunity to earn industry recognized credentials.

Critical Initiatives: to implement standards-based, targeted, engaging instruction to increase career readiness credentials and student attendance. Implement standards based, targeted ELA & Math instruction.

Objectives: Increase Career Readiness Indicators passing percentage by 5% through credentialing. Overall CTEC attendance is equal to 90% present for all programs.

Credentialing Activity 1: Increase job placement in industry through Advisory Committee, Industry Tours and visits, and collaboration through the community partnerships.

Credentialing Activity 2: Data talks with faculty and administrators and examine the details the information provides for each program.

Benchmark Date 5/20/22: Using program assessments, exit tickets, module unit tests, teacher observations and common assessments.

SEAL Activity 1 Attendance: PLC meetings to analyze student data including attendance, grades, and discipline.

SEAL Activity 2 Attendance: Integrate differentiated instruction techniques to encourage student engagement and collaboration. (Lesson plans, hands-on activities, student evaluations)

Benchmark Date 5/20/22: Using program assessments, exit tickets, module unit tests, teacher observations and common assessments, and student attendance data.

Math

ELA

We will increase reading and vocabulary activities using technology or textbook activities focusing on program related terminology.
