

LINE SPACING: Double (2.0)

PAGE NUMBERS: INSERT → PAGE NUMBER → TOP OF
PAGE → PLAIN NUMBER 3 → Type your LAST name in front of
the number. Space once after name. Click Close Header and

Footer.

HEADING: In the upper left-hand corner of the page, type your name, your teacher's name, the class, and the date.



TITLE: Enter after you type the date and center the title.

BEGIN TYPING: Press the TAB key to indent the first line of each paragraph. Do not put extra lines between paragraphs.

PAGE BREAK: After the last paragraph of your essay: INSERT→PAGE BREAK

WORKS CITED TITLE: Center and type the words Works Cited

ENTER YOUR MLA CITATIONS in alphabetical order by the first letter of the citation (ignoring "A," "An," & "The").

HANGING INDENT: HOME→PARAGRAPH→ INDENTATION→SPECIAL: HANGING 0.5"
