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Principal's Message WHES Summer Reading Incentive Program

I want to call to the attention of all WHES parents the great program being initiated this summer for all interested students. The program is the **WHES Summer Reading Incentive Program** and it seeks to encourage students to pursue reading all throughout the summer. Designed in cooperation with the WHES PTA and the new Whitefield Library, the summer reading program seeks to combat the skills regression that can occur for students when they stop exercising their "Reading Muscles." Simply put, students who do not continue to read over the summer vacation will lose a measure of their reading skills that they've worked so hard to build over the school year. This is true for students of all ages which is why our program is open to all K-8 students. Beyond the benefits to a student's reading ability, there are also some very practical incentives available to participants as well. First, students can log their reading times and make themselves eligible for the Freemasons, "Read to Ride" Program in which students who've met their summer reading goal can submit their name into a pool with a possibility of winning a new bicycle. Reaching their reading goal will also lead to a student receiving a \$10.00 gift certificate to our Scholastic Book Fair (sponsored by the WHES PTA) as well as receiving an invite to a "Summer Reading Party" that will celebrate each students' accomplishment. This will be held shortly after school begins in August. Wonderful reasons to commit to reading throughout the summer vacation!

The way this program works is that students who wish to participate will receive a summer reading goal from their current classroom teacher. This goal will be personalized for the student and could be minutes of reading per day or week, pages read per day or week or books completed over the summer. Parents will assist in keeping the student's reading log to verify their reading activity and then logs will be collected when school begins in the fall. It is as simple as that! To facilitate the students' efforts over the summer, the new Whitefield Library and the WHES School Library will have summer hours to allow families to check out books. This will be a great summer to READ Whitefield!
