Too often after an act of youth violence or self-harm, facts come out that friends suspected or knew something was going to happen, but didn't know what to do with that information. In fact, in four out of five school shootings, at least one other person knew of the shooter's intent. Additionally, seven out of 10 people who die by suicide told someone of their plans or gave some type of warning or indication.

Imagine how much tragedy could be averted if these individuals said something?

This is why we brought Sandy Hook Promise's *Say Something* program to Camden County Schools!

Say Something raises awareness and teaches students to recognize warning signs, signals and threats; and to "say something" to a trusted adult. The system also allows you to report concerns of domestic violence, abuse, animal abuse, bullying, inappropriate relationships, drugs or alcohol use, abuse, possession, or selling, or ANY concern you may have that needs attention.
