## **Scholarships**

#### **General Information**

Financial assistance is available to all adult students attending Red River Technology Center. This assistance includes federal and state financial aid sources, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, as well as various scholarships.

Federal law requires that any adult student applying for Title IV aid (Pell Grant) must document high school completion through a diploma, final transcript, or any nationally or state recognized test for high school completion. Students who complete their secondary education in a home school environment must provide appropriate documentation of that fact with proof of courses taken.

## **Applying for Assistance**

## Rodney J. Love Next Step Scholarship

### Who is eligible?

Anyone who meets the following criteria:

- Attend a full-time program
- Have a high school diploma or a high school equivalency diploma
- AND -
- Be within two years of high school graduation
- OR -
- Be actively pursuing\* an alternative diploma and be within two years of when your graduating class finished high school
- OR -
- Live in the RRTC School District and have a certificate of eligibility for Veteran's Benefits.

\*Actively pursuing indicates that the student is participating in Adult Education classes, registered to take the GED® Exam and/or passed the exam within the two-year time frame allowed for the tuition scholarship.

## How do I keep the scholarship

- Maintain at least a B average
- Maintain at least 90 percent attendance
- Make satisfactory progress in the program by passing competencies at designated times
- Maintain at least part-time enrollment until completion of the program (Scholarship is good for one full-time program of choosing with no interruption of enrollment)

### **Line of Duty Scholarship**

### Who is eligible?

Anyone who meets the following criteria:

- Children of Oklahoma peace officers who have given their lives in the line of duty
- Children of Oklahoma firefighters who have given their lives in the line of duty
- Children of Oklahoma emergency medical technicians who have given their lives in the line of duty
- Children of members of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System who have given their lives in the line of duty, or whose disability is by means of personal and traumatic injury of a catastrophic nature and occurred in the line of duty
- \*The scholarship shall be limited to a period of five (5) years

#### What are the scholarships worth?

• The scholarship amount will not exceed the cost of tuition per year for full-time or part-time attendance, nor would the amount exceed the actual cost of tuition for a single program. The scholarship does not cover the entire cost of the Practical Nursing program but may be applied, with the student owing the remaining balance.
