

INTRODUCTION

The High School Community Service Project is a meaningful learning experience that is part of every student's educational responsibility in the Millersburg Area School District. The project gives each student an opportunity to give back to their school and community through service projects which demonstrate the merits of Citizenship, Responsibility, Honesty, Integrity, Trustworthiness, Self-Respect, Courage, Perseverance, Respect, Caring, and Fairness. These same merits were demonstrated by the Susquehannock Indians and represented by the feathers that were worn in their headbands.

This High School Community Service Project Handbook describes the components of the project which includes an activity log, an additional hours form, and the final Checklist.

The Millersburg Area School District School Board has adopted the High School Community Service Project as a requirement for graduation from high school. More importantly, however, the Millersburg Area School District believes the Project is a positive learning activity that serves all students well as they pursue their life goals, both now and in the future.

The High School Community Service Project must be completed successfully for a student to fulfill District graduation requirements. Any student who has not completed the requirements for graduation will not be permitted to participate in graduation ceremonies, nor will the student receive a diploma until the project is satisfactorily completed.

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SYNOPSIS

Students will be required to accumulate twenty (20) hours of approved service*. In doing service projects, students will be learning about citizenship, responsibility, honesty, integrity, trustworthiness, self-discipline, courage, perseverance, respect, caring, and fairness. To aid the progress of this project, students will attend one (1) Advisement Meeting per marking period each marking period of their high school career totaling twelve (12) meetings before their senior year, and four (4) during their senior year.

*Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, students in the following classes have had their Community Service Hours reduced.

Classes of $2023 - 2024 - \underline{15}$ hours needed in total.

REQUIRED FORMS

Students are required to complete an Activity Log (Form 1405). This form needs to be signed by the Supervisor at each log entry **before each Advisement Meeting**. This form must also be signed by the Advisor at each Advisement Meeting of the Junior Year.

Students **and** Advisors MUST complete the Checklist (Form 1410). After the student completes the 20 hours, the student must present to the students in an Advisement Meeting. Following the presentation, the Advisor will sign form 1410 and submit it to the guidance office.

Students may be issued Additional Requirements/Hours. Additional Requirements may be issued up to the day the student completes the final presentation during the student's Senior Year. Seniors should complete their projects by March 15 of their senior year.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Students receiving disciplinary actions from the school may be required to perform additional elements (i.e., hours over and above the existing requirements for the Community Service Project) in the following manner:

Each Level 3 offense may be assigned additional hours of community service

Each Level 4 offense may be assigned additional hours of community service

*This information will be provided to the Advisor prior each Advisement Meeting. The Advisor will review this information with the student.

ACTIVITY LOG GUIDELINES

The student MUST document progress toward completion of the Graduation Project. Progress should be occurring on a regular basis, and the student MUST show **at least 20 hours (15 for Class of '23-24)** worked in community service. Up to 10 hours may include time spent <u>volunteering</u> during school sponsored activities (e.g. conservation club, student council) and be accumulated throughout ninth, tenth, and eleventh grade years.

The student will be required to log the date(s) of work, how long the student worked, who was involved, what was done, and where the work was done. The student must write a minimum of three sentences for each log entry. Recording thought and/or reactions each time will aid the student when preparing the final oral presentation.

PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

The Presentation MUST be given to the Advisement Class through the use of any type of media such as Power Point, Pictures, iMovie, Video, etc. The Presentation should be of an appropriate length to adequately describe the community service hours. The Presentation MUST demonstrate the merits listed in the introduction. Presentations that are incomplete or do not receive a satisfactory rating from the advisor MUST be revised and presented again until they are of acceptable quality.

The Presentation should begin with a brief summary of the service project(s). Define the goal of the project(s) and explain why the project was chosen. Then explain what was learned from doing the project. The student should also indicate what was learned about oneself and explain the impact doing the project has had on the community, career or educational goals.

SENIORS

Student project due date is the 135th day of school (Thursday, March 23, 2023) for the members of the senior class. If project is not presented by that date, the student will be placed on Academic Probation and lose all school extra-curricular privileges, including loss of parking privilege, until the project is completed.
