

## ADVANCED COLLEGE PLACEMENT AND DUAL CREDIT COURSES

The Board recognizes that there may be some high school students who exhibit exceptional academic progress and who are capable of performing college-level work while enrolled in high school. In order to encourage these students to their fullest capabilities, assistance will be given to these students to enroll in advanced placement or dual credit courses. However, all related costs, including tuition, fees, books, and supplies, will be at the students' expense.

A qualified high school student may enroll in a college-level course offered by an approved college or university either on-line or on campus, and may be released from high school attendance for such hours as are required for the college course(s) if the student is taking the course for dual credit.

To enroll in Advanced Placement or dual credit courses, students must be classified as a Junior or Senior with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. Juniors or Seniors with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 but less than 3.0 may enroll in dual credit courses with approval of the principal and guidance counselor.
