Dear AP Students and Parents,

We believe every AP student can earn college credit by learning at a high level, so we're excited to announce the AP Program will launch three big improvements to help more students achieve this goal. These changes will support your learning throughout the year and help you earn credit through AP Exams.

**Here's what's on the way:**

- A new online classroom, called AP Classroom, with free practice resources and feedback for each unit of your AP course to chart your progress toward mastering the content and skills needed for success.
- Personalized ID labels that save you time and energy by reducing the amount of information you need to bubble on your answer sheet.
- A new fall AP Exam registration deadline that has helped more students earn qualifying scores of 3 or higher.

These changes to AP roll out at the start of next school year, so you don't have to take any actions now. Over the summer, you should make sure you have a College Board account and know your login information. When you return to school in the fall, your AP teacher will help you access the practice resources and your principal will explain your school's process for ordering AP Exams.
