Parental & Family Engagement Policy

Statement of Purpose:

Parental Involvement in Developing the Policy:

Coyle Public Schools Schoolwide Federal Program Team, consisting of parents, members of the community, teachers, district administrators, will meet to evaluate our schoolwide programs twice a year--spring and fall. At these times, the Parental & Family Engagement Policy will be reviewed annually by the district improvement team and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of students, parents, and the school.

Title I and the Law:

Funding - Our school gets funds from the federal government for special programs and services under "Title I"—that is, Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015. Title I services are for eligible students who need extra academic help, regardless of their economic background. The amount of money we get under Title I depends on how many students in our school are from low-income families.

Annual Meeting for Title I Parents:

At the Schoolwide Federal Programs Annual Meetings, parents will be given information about the guidelines for all programs in which Coyle Public Schools participates. Parents will be given copies of the district's Parental & Family Engagement Policy, and will be offered a chance to become involved in revising and updating the policies as needed. Parents are encouraged to volunteer to serve on schoolwide committees.

School – Parent Compacts:

In accordance with Schoolwide Federal Programs regulations, the district shall develop jointly with, and make available to, parents of participating children a school-parent compact that is designed to increase the sharing of responsibility between families and schools for the high performance of students. Parents, teachers, and administrators who will be responsible for carrying out the compact shall participate in its development.

Every parent shall receive a copy of the school-parent compact in the enrollment packet when they enroll each year. Parents are urged to discuss the compact with their children.

Staff/Parent Communications:

Parents are welcomed and encouraged to communicate with Coyle Public School employees, as needed, through a variety of means, including email, telephone, written communication, parent/

teacher conferences, the Remind App, Twitter, and the district website. Communication with parents will also include the district online newspaper. Parents are encouraged to take the initiative in calling their child's teacher when they are concerned about a problem. Parents also have access to their children's grades and attendance through the Gradebook Portal (MAS Wengage).

Evaluation:

The Coyle Public Schools Schoolwide Federal Program Team will be involved in the process of school improvement. Parents of children in the schoolwide program will be part of this group. The aim will be to evaluate the district, collecting information in a variety of ways. There will be an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the Parental & Family Engagement Policy, and parents will be asked for their input. The evaluation will include an assessment of how much parental involvement is increasing and what barriers to parental participation still need to be overcome. The school district will revise its policy on the basis of this annual review.
