Locations

A+ After School currently serves three schools in the Wautoma Area School District: Parkside (4-8 grade), Redgranite (K-5 grade), & Riverview (K-3 grade). The schools provide not only space for programming but a strong support system including financial, custodial, technical, and administrative support as well as general supplies and guidance. The positive relationship and support of the school district contributes immensely to the success of the program.

Who We Serve

During the 2015-16 school year an average of 148 children attended each day (220 were enrolled). 62% of participants were eligible for free & reduced lunch (all students in the district received free lunch this year), 19% were non-white, & 9% were students with special education needs.

Program Activities

A+ offers a variety of activities daily like; Homework Help, Academic Support, and Enrichment Activities in Academics (school subjects), Character & Youth Development, Recreation, Art, Career & Life Skills and STEM. A snack and 15-30 minutes of free time are offered each day for students to relax and refocus after the school day ends.

Team Members

A+ had 31 paid part-time employees ranging from certified teachers and teacher's aides, to parents of participants, professional community members and high school students. 856 volunteer hours were provided by 69 community members!



Program History

History of A+:

In 2000, a group of community members, parents and school district staff recognized the need for an after school program to serve the Wautoma community. Their hard work to make this vision a reality was rewarded in 2001 when the district received a 21st Century CLC Grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This initial grant was used to provide after school programs at Parkside (The Community Learning Center), for 4-8th graders 4 days a week. In the beginning the program served just 30 kids per day but quickly grew to over 70 students per day. By the end of the 3-year grant period, this program had formed the foundation for what was to become the A+ Program.

Around 2004, the name A+ was created. The PLUS stood for: "Promoting Lifelong Learning and Uniting Schools and Communities". In 2004 Riverview Elementary applied for and received a 5 year, \$500,000 grant, from the state 21CCLC program. Without funding for the other schools, Parkside and Redgranite programs were supported by the school district, the county and fundraisers for the next several years.

In 2008, the Reach the Peak Race Fundraiser started and funds raised were used for scholarships to help students in need attend A+. In 2008, the Wautoma High School was awarded a 5 year 21CCLC grant, Riverview applied for and received a 5 year continuation grant in 2009, and Parkside received the 5 year 21CCLC grant in 2010. The school district









and Fund 80 continued to help support the Redgranite and Riverview A+ Programs during this time. In 2013, WHS was not selected for a continuation grant and the High School took on the task of offering academic support for its students after school 2 days a week. During the summer of 2013, the A+ program received a makeover, including a new logo, new leadership, and an updated website. In 2014, Riverview was awarded a 3rd cycle of funding for 5 additional years (\$50,000 per year). Parkside was awarded a 5-year 21st Century Community Learning Center Continuation Grant for the 2015 - 2019 school years for a total of \$275,000 allowing programming to continue at Parkside School.

The Redgranite program continued to operate with support from SAGE, Title 1, Fund 80 and program fees. A+ programming has expanded over the years to not only include homework and enrichment but also tutoring, field trips, parent education, bashes and community service activities.

The A+ program celebrated the completion of it's 15th year of programming in May of 2016!


Future of A+:

A+ will continue to seek out new community partners, strengthen the school day connection, and create opportunities for family education while making improving student academic achievement a priority. Funding for the program is always a concern and with budgets getting tighter we need more support now than ever before through funding, volunteering and community support!


Program Results

ATTENDANCE:

25% of K-8 students in the Wautoma Area School District enrolled in the A+ Program for the 2015-16 school year. Of those, 91% were regular attendees (30+ days of attendance) with an average of 123 attendance days per regular attendee. Attendance of Regular Attendees increased 11 days from last year and 64% attended more than 120 days!




Number of Regular Students Attending: 30 day increments




PARENT SURVEYS: 54% return rate

99 parents completed the Spring 2016 A+ Survey. 98% of parents felt the after school program reduced stress at home, 100% believe their child benefited from being in the program, and 100% were satisfied with the activities and programs offered.

STAR Academic Results: Regular Attendees that met their growth goal




ACADEMICS:


TEACHER SURVEYS:

Riverview students visited the Flyte Family Farm and went to the Waupaca Rosa Movie Theater during early release days this year.







Parkside

Parkside Grant Objective Results:

Academic:

At least 65% of RA (regular attendees) will meet or exceed their targeted growth score (35 SGP) on the STAR Math & Reading/Early Literacy Assessment from Fall 20145to Spring 2016.

- Math: 73% met or exceeded their growth goal
- Reading: 73% met or exceeded their growth goal

75% of RA that warrant improvement in turning homework in on time, completing homework to the teacher's satisfaction, and academic performance will show improvement per the Spring Teacher Survey.

• 47%, 57%, 62% respectively



Behavior:

70% or more of regular attendees in need of behavior improvement will have teacher reported improvements per the Spring Teacher Survey.

• 23% **68% showed no change

70% or more of RA will have no detentions logged during the school year.

• 63% of students that regular attended had no detentions during the school year.

100 students or more will regularly attend the PS A+ Program.

• 59 students attended 30 or more days. ** Only 72 registered this year.

Parent/Family Engagement:

PS A+ will offer at least 4 family/parent events that focus on educating parents.

• PS offered 4 family nights that included STEM, math, literacy, nutrition and culture based activities.

At least 75 family members will attend 2 or more CLC family offerings.

• 40 family members attended at least 2 family events, 89 family members attended at least one family event.

Riverview

Riverview Grant Objective Results for 2015-16:

Academic:

At least 55% of RA (regular attendees) will meet or exceed their individual growth goal in Math and Reading/Early Literacy, based on STAR tests in Spring 2016.

- Math: 78% met or exceeded their growth goal
- Reading/Early Literacy: 78% met or exceeded their growth goal

80% of A+ RA will meet/exceed their targeted scores on Guided Reading assessments by Spring 2016: 72% met/exceeded their guided reading targeted scores



At least 75% of RA will have teacher reported improvements on homework completion and turning in homework on time: 48% and 34% respectively of the students that needed to improve.

Behavior:

50% or more of RA will have teacher reported improvements on student behavior: 22% of those that needed to improve in student behavior had teacher reported improvements.

70% or more of RA will have no discipline referrals during the school day: 88% had no referrals!

Attendance:

120 students or more will attend the CLC: 85 students attended this school year.

100 students or more will regularly attend (30+ days) the A+ Program: 82 students were regular attendees

RA will have at least a 96% attendance rate in school: 46% of RV A+ RA met this objective

Parent Engagement:

100 family members or more will attend 1 or more CLC family engagement offerings: 81 family members attended one or more family events.

90% of family members who participated in the CLC will report that services satisfactorily met their family's specific needs: 59% of parents agreed

90% or more of participating adult family members will agree that the program involves families in program feedback, decision-making, and/or planning: 100% of parents completing the May 2016 surveys agreed.

She has benefitted from the A+ program in numerous ways. Being able to complete her homework at A+ allows us to have time to spend together as a family in the evenings. The enrichment programs that are offered help to teach many new skill sets. She really enjoyed the Razzle Dazzle Fashion Club, and Jewelry Making, getting to help out at the Day Care was also a great experience for her. The social interactions at A+ are also very



important, and help the kids to learn how to respond to different situations. Especially when deal-



ing with children who may need a little guidance in appropriate social conduct.

A+ also helps our family, as both my husband and I work. It gives us assurance and peace of mind knowing that she is in a safe place, and not at home in front of the TV or on the computer.

The staff members at Redgranite A+ are outstanding. They are patient with her and her specific situation and the difficulties that arise from it. Miss Michele has gone out of her way to help

her with her academic, social, and emotional needs.

Redgranite Comments:

"All of my students have made progress this year, but one in particular is worth noting. He consistently attended and read at A+ all year. This student moved to our district as a 2^{nd} grader, but was barely able to read a book at the kindergarten level. Our initial concern was that there might be a learning disability, but this turned out to not be the case. So we began a very intensive intervention program involving daily one-on-one instruction from myself, and this student rereading his books every night at A+. This student started out at instructional level C (based on Fountas and Pinnell) and he ended up reading books at level L by the end of the year!!! This is actually approaching grade level reading. To say



that amount of progress is incredible would be an understatement! But it is due, in large part, to an amazing collaborative effort between myself, his classroom teacher, the A+ staff and Michele, and the student himself! This is one great success story in the area of reading, a subject which is so critical in all other content areas as well."

"This year, nine of my fourteen students attended the A+ after school program. These students received help on their homework and reinforcement on basic math and reading skills that they may not have received outside of

the classroom. Not only were academic skills reinforced through homework help, but responsibility was also reinforced.

The A+ After School Program also provides students with so much extra opportunity that they wouldn't normally have. This year some of my third graders designed pieces and participated in a fashion show, learned about archery, exercised through yoga, ice skated, created fossils, took a self-defense class, and participated in STEM activities through our

local library. These engaging experiences spark student interest and get them excited about learning in different ways, making them more well-rounded members of our school community.

My students made tremendous gains this year academically, socially, behaviorally, and in their character. There is not a doubt in my mind that the A+ After School Program is largely responsible for that. Redgranite Elementary School is the heart of its community and the A+ After School Program has proved that it is a vital part because of how well if fosters learning and growth."






Interesting Facts:

*2015-16 Program Fees:\$45/quarter, \$150/year

*Cost to participants: \$1/day or \$.40/hour (2.5 hours per day)

*It cost A+ \$7.58 per student per day (based on average attendance during the 2015-2016 school year)

*The Reach the Peak Fundraiser (sponsored by Thrivent Financial & ThedaCare) supported \$2,213 in scholarships for 51 students to enroll in A+ this past year and \$3,500 for an AmeriCorps Member to support students during school and after school with academic, social and health skills.
