Overview





Locations

A+ After School currently serves three schools in the Wautoma Area School District: Parkside (4-8 grade), Redgranite (K-5 grade), & Riverview (K-3 grade). The schools provide not only space for programming but a strong support system including financial, custodial, technical, and administrative support as well as general supplies and guidance. The positive relationship and support of the school district contributes immensely to the success of the program.

Who We Serve

During the 2014-2015 school year an average of 223 children attended each day (383 were enrolled). 63% of participants were enrolled in free or reduced lunch, 23% were non-white, & 8% were special education students.

Program Activities

A+ offers a variety of activities daily like; Homework Help, Academic Support, and Enrichment Activities in Academics (school subjects), Character & Youth Development, Recreation, Art, Career & Life Skills and STEM. A snack and 15-30 minutes of free time are offered each day for students to relax and refocus after the school day ends.

Team Members

A+ consisted of over 39 paid part-time employees ranging from certified teachers and teacher's aides, to parents of participants, professional community members and high school students. 257 volunteer hours were provided by 29 community members!

Program History

History of A+:

In 2000, a group of community members, parents and school district staff recognized the need for an after school program to serve the Wautoma community. Their hard work to make this vision a reality was rewarded in 2001 when the district received a 21st Century CLC Grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This initial grant was used to provide after school programs at Parkside (The Community Learning Center), for 4-8th graders 4 days a week. In the beginning the program served just 30 kids per day but quickly grew to over 70 students per day. By the end of the 3-year grant period, this program had formed the foundation for what was to become the A+ Program.

Around 2004, the name A+ was created. The PLUS stood for: "Promoting Lifelong Learning and Uniting Schools and Communities". In 2004 Riverview Elementary applied for and received a 5 year, \$500,000 grant, from the state 21CCLC program. Without funding for the other schools, Parkside and Redgranite programs were supported by the school district, the county and fundraisers for the next several years.

In 2008, the Reach the Peak Race Fundraiser started and funds raised were used for scholarships to help students in need attend A+. In 2008, Wautoma High School was awarded a 5 year 21CCLC grant, Riverview applied for and received a 5 year continuation grant in 2009, and Parkside received the 5 year 21CCLC grant in 2010. The school district

and Fund 80 continued to help support the Redgranite and Riverview A+ Programs during this time. In 2013, WHS was not selected for a continuation grant and the High School took on the task of offering academic support for its students after school 2 days a week. During the summer of 2013, the A+ program received a makeover, including a new logo, new leadership, and an updated website. In 2014, Riverview was awarded a 3rd cycle of funding for 5 additional years (\$50,000 per year).

Currently the A+ program is thriving, with nearly 390 students enrolled and over 220 on average attending each day. The Redgranite program continues to operate with support from SAGE, Title 1, Fund 80 and program fees. A+ programming has expanded over the years to not only include homework and enrichment but also tutoring, field trips, parent education, bashes and community service activities.

Future of A+:

Parkside was awarded a 5-year 21st Century Community Learning Center Continuation Grant for 2015 - 2019 school years for a total of \$275,000 allowing programming to continue at Parkside School.

A+ will continue to seek out new community partners, strengthen the school day connection, and create opportunities for family education while making improving student academic achievement a priority.












Program Results

ATTENDANCE:

39% of K-8 students in the Wautoma Area School District enrolled in the A+ Program for the 2014-15 school year. Of those, 88% were regular attendees (30+ days of attendance) with an average of 112 attendance days per regular attendee. Attendance of Regular Attendees increased 8 days from last year and 50% of RA attended more than 120 days!








PARENT SURVEYS: 40.5% return rate


127 parents completed the Spring 2015 A+ Survey. 96% of parents felt the after school program reduced stress at home, 96% believe their child benefited from being in the program, and


ACADEMICS:








DEMOGRAPHICS OF A+ REGISTERED STUDENTS:

Field Trips



Parkside students spent an early release day at Camp Lakotah with hotdogs over the fire, archery, hiking, gaga pit and of course laser tag!





Redgranite students went bowling at Lambeaul Lanes in Redgranite during one of their early release days! Older students at Redgranite also were able to visit the WHS fitness center this year and try golfing at Waushara Country Club.

Riverview students visited Animal Haven Zoo in Weyauwega during the final early release day of the year. Parkside and Riverview students also saw a movie at Rosa Theater in Waupaca in February.





Parkside Grant Objective Results:

Academic:

At least 65% of RA (regular attendees) will meet or exceed their targeted growth score (50 SGP) on the STAR Math & Reading/Early Literacy Assessment from Fall 2014 to Spring 2015.

- Math: 64.57% met or exceeded
- Reading/Early Literacy: 52.76% met or exceeded

65% of RA that warrant improvement in turning homework in on time, completing homework to the teacher's satisfaction, and academic performance will show improvement per the May Teacher Survey.

• 57%, 62%, 58% respectively



Behavior:

10% reduction in student behavior referrals of RA from 1st semester to 2nd semester.

• Behavior referrals increased 8% (57 1st semester to 62 second semester) however if we include RA who did not attend 2nd semester there is a 95% increase in behaviors. Of the 25 students with behaviors in 1st semester 8 (students here all year) decreased their behavior while only 3 students who stopped attending decreased their behaviors. 5 students who attended all year increased their behaviors vs. 7 students who stopped attending 2nd semester. Of the 30 RA that had behaviors during second semester, 9 had only 1 incident all year, and 9 were not enrolled in A+ during second semester.

RA will have a 95% attendance rate in school.

• 73% of RA had a school attendance rate of 95% or higher)

100 students or more will regularly attend the PS A+ Program.

• 130 students attended 30 or more days.

Parent/Family Engagement:

PS A+ will offer at least 4 family/parent events that focus on educating parents.

PS offered QPR (2 classes), Money Smarts (2 sessions), ESL (12 classes), Love & Logic Book Club (7 classes).

At least 100 family members will attend 1 or more CLC family offerings.

• 40 parents attended family events including classes, field trips, and special events.

90% of parents will report overall program satisfaction in Spring 2015.

• 93% of PS parents reported they were satisfied (30.5% return rate)

70% of students will report they enjoy attending the A+ program.

• 14% almost always enjoy it, 53% sometimes enjoy it (40% return rate)

Riverview Grant Objective Results for 2014-2015:

Academic:

At least 65% of RA (regular attendees) will be at/above benchmark in Math, Reading/Early Literacy, based on STAR tests in Spring 2015.

- Math: 72.87% at/above benchmark
- Reading/Early Literacy: 80.2% at/above benchmark

80% of A+ RA will meet/exceed their targeted scores on Guided Reading assessments by Spring 2015: 78.9% met/exceeded their guided reading targeted scores

At least 75% of RA will have teacher reported improvements on homework completion and class participation: 61% and 49% respectively of the students that needed to improve.



At least 75% of RA will show improvement on the 10 indicators of acceptable school functioning per the PPICS Teacher Survey: 44% of students showed improvement on average across all 10 indicators.

Behavior:

70% or more of RA will have teacher reported improvements on student behavior: 38% of those that needed to improve in student behavior had teacher reported improvements.

70% or more of RA will have no discipline referrals during the school day: 86% had no referrals!

Attendance:

170 students or more will attend the CLC: 141 students attended this school year.

135 students or more will regularly attend (30+ days) the A+ Program: 131 students were regular attendees

RA will have at least a 96% attendance rate in school: 95.1% of RV A+ RA met this objective

Parent Engagement:

100 family members or more will attend 2 or more CLC family engagement offerings: 40 family members attended 2+ times, while another 56 family members attended 1 event or class.

90% of family members who participated in the CLC will report that services satisfactorily met their family's specific needs: 100% of parents agreed

90% of more adult members who participate in literacy-related activities will report improved ability to address the literacy needs of their family: 5 parents completing surveys - all agree! (ESL Class Spring 2015)

90% or more of participating adult family members will agree that the program involves families in program feedback, decision-making, and/or planning: 93% of parents completing the May 2015 surveys agreed.




Total Program Funding \$287,587

Next year Grant funding will drop to \$125,000 from \$150,000.

*In-Kind Support provided by the school district was approximately \$85,000 (utilities, custodial services, storage, office supplies, copier use & paper, administrative services, transportation, insurance, etc.)

Interesting Facts:

- *2014-15 Program Fees:\$25/quarter, \$100/year
- *Cost to participants: \$.57/day or \$.23/hour (2.5 hours per day)
- *It cost A+ \$6.87 per student per day (based on average attendance during the 2014-2015 school year)
- *\$6,810 in scholarship funds, provided by the Reach the Peak Race Fundraiser (sponsored by Thrivent Financial & Adams-Columbia Electric Cooperative) was provided for 130 students to enroll in A+ this past year.
