# **Building Renovations and Elementary Addition**

The district received bids in all areas of the proposed scope of work. Darin Klein, from Site LogIQ, compiled the results for the board's review and Gavin Benson presented a PowerPoint with possible options the board could take. J. Sondgeroth and several other board members expressed disappointment with SiteLogIQ and the current situation. The board discussed whether to proceed with the original plan or to reduce the scope of the project. The board will need to schedule at least one special board meeting date to review the bids and make a decision on how they want to proceed.

## Superintendent Report

#### Good News Report

Supt. Bailey congratulated the following students for receiving their FFA Jackets & Scarves as part of the Bright Futures Program: Clayton Gustad, Mallory Gant, Sutton Stluka, Tucker Van Zee, Sutton Vanderpol, Kyler Strand, Abigail Olds, and Sawyer Iedema

The Varsity Boys, JV Boys, and JV Girls cross country teams were congratulated for winning the Parker Meet. Ty Rolland was recognized for placing 1st in the Platte-Geddes JV meet.

## Superintendent's Report

The Title I Consolidated Application has been approved for the 2022-2023 school year. The district is currently undergoing a Title I state review and the Special Education review will begin soon.

South Dakota students and families can access a new, online tutoring program, staffed by college students who are preparing to become teachers. The Dakota Dreams Online Tutoring Program offers free online tutoring to K-12 students across the state. One-on-one tutoring sessions can help students with their homework, tackle specific trouble areas, and address broader educational concepts. Information has been emailed to families.

Based on data submission it has been determined that the district has met the teacher compensation accountability. The teacher compensation accountability for FY2023 requires the district to meet or exceed the average teacher compensation accountability of FY2017.

Due to the amount of federal funding allocated to public school districts as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, the School Finance Accountability Board, with the approval of the Joint Committee on Appropriations, passed a resolution providing a blanket waiver of excess cash balance penalties applicable to general state aid calculations in FY2023.

Vacancies still exist in the kitchen and for an evening custodian. Supt. Bailey has been in contact with a few people regarding the position in the kitchen, but nothing has been successful thus far.

Mrs. Knecht, Mr. Hunhoff, and Supt. Bailey will be attending the second Balanced Leadership training in Pierre on October 24.

Supt. Bailey reviewed the school district's report card with the board of education.

## **Business Manager Report**

Schoenfish & Co., Inc. completed the school district audit on Monday, September 26. The only formal comment will be for segregation of duties. Overall, the audit went very well. K. Holter thanked Jess Sondgeroth and Dennis DeBoer for attending the exit review.

#### **Elementary Principal Report**

The State of South Dakota Department of Education is offering a STEM Grant opportunity for elementary schools across South Dakota. Mrs. Knecht submitted an application to receive around \$40,000 worth of supplies for the STEAM Program as well as a few "STEAM Camp" options for the K-5th grade students. Grant recipients will be notified during the first week of November.

The "Picture in Writing" Program has been a huge success. Students are painting and writing in grades ½ K-5th grade. Works of art were proudly displayed during parent/teacher conferences last week.

October is Bullying Prevention Month. An emphasis has been placed on treating others with kindness, playing well with others, and including all children while on the playground. This week, the PG Elementary Student Council is sponsoring a "Bullying Awareness Poster/Coloring Contest" to encourage KIND behaviors from everyone.

The first set of parent/teacher conferences were held on Thursday, October 6. Elementary staff strive to meet with all parents in person or by phone to discuss their child's academic, behavioral, and emotional strengths and weaknesses.

## Secondary Principal Report

Mr. Hunhoff congratulated the middle school athletes as some have finished their fall sports seasons. Sixth grade has finished their first fall sport and saw much success. The middle school football went 6-2 this season.

Abigail DeKam will be auditioning for the All-State Orchestra on Tuesday, October 11 in Huron.

On Thursday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, Mrs. Graves invited four local business leaders to the school to conduct mock interviews with the Ag Leadership students. These individuals included Chris McKinney from Summit Contracting, Cordell Muilenburg from Platte Health Center, Angie Rasmussen from Carlon & Millar, and Colette Mesman from the Platte Area Chamber of Commerce. The students developed resumes in Senior Experience Class and then filled out job applications and wrote cover letters in Ag Leadership. By practicing these career skills, Mrs. Graves hopes that students gain confidence as they pursue the next chapter in their lives after graduation. Mr. Hunhoff thanked the men and women that took the time to meet with the students.

Both Shop 1 and Shop 2 classes will start going to Trail-Eze for a welding unit starting Monday, October 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be a 6–8-week unit. The students will travel out to Trail-Eze every day for class where they will be taught the safety skills and techniques to be proficient in welding. Once they have demonstrated proficiency, the students will practice their welding skills by welding prefab parts for the Trail-Eze trailers. Upon completion of this unit, students will be able to come back to the school and do projects on their own.

Caitlin DeGroot applied to be a part of the Dakota Dreams Leadership Academy. This program offers teachers the opportunity to develop their leadership skills and to explore other roles and responsibilities within the educational system.

Mr. Hunhoff is polling teachers and students about the interest in an Educators Rising Chapter. This program is to help support students who are interested in education-related careers.

Parent Teacher Conferences were held at the High School Thursday, October 6th. The teachers did a fantastic job of communicating with parents both by email and in house.

#### First Reading Fundraising Procedure

A draft of a fundraising procedure was reviewed and given first reading.

#### **Approve Yondr Procedures**

Supt. Bailey and Mr. Hunhoff have been working with Yondr representatives and other districts who use the pouches to develop procedures and guidelines. These procedures and guidelines will be reviewed with staff and students during a presentation. Information will also be shared with parents/guardians prior to deployment which is set for Monday, October 31 and Tuesday, November 1. Board members reviewed the procedures and guidelines. Several concerns were expressed with the current guidelines. Supt. Bailey will make some revisions and present to the board for a second reading at a special board meeting which will be held to review the building project bids.

## First Reading Section H Policies, Negotiations

The board of education gave first reading to Section H Policies, Negotiations.

#### Appoint Delegate Assembly Representative

ASBSD's 2022 Delegate Assembly is scheduled for Friday, November 18 in Pierre at the Ramkota Conference Center, at 1 p.m. and each member district should appoint a board member to represent their school board and vote on positions that help set legislative direction. Motion R. Summerville, seconded M. Petersen appointing Jess Sondgeroth as ASBSD Delegate Assembly Representative. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

#### **Approve Out of State Travel Request**

Supt. Bailey serves on the AASA National Early Learning Rural Cohort. The first in-person cohort meeting will take place in Boston, MA on November 14-16. Bailey received a scholarship, which covers all expenses. The district will cover the expense up front and then be reimbursed by AASA. District policy requires all out of state travel requests be approved by the school board. Motion R. Summerville, seconded R. Varilek approving the out of state travel request for Supt. Joel Bailey to attend the AASA National Early Learning Rural Cohort in Boston, MA. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

## Approve Picture in Writing Purchase

The Picture in Writing program has been very successful thus far. Mrs. Knecht and the elementary teachers would like to purchase another unit. The program will be purchased using ESSER III Funds and falls under the learning loss category of allowable expenses. The goal is to have all of the training and curriculum purchased this year to meet ESSER funding requirements. Motion D. Starr, seconded M. Petersen approving the Picture in Writing Purchase in the amount of \$6,600.00. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.
