Good News Report

Congratulations were extended to the Platte-Geddes Track Team and coaches for their qualification and performances at the state meet. The boys team received 5th place overall. Athletes participating at the state meet were: Brianna DeGroot -100m dash, 200m dash, 400m dash; Regan Hoffman - long jump; Hallie Sprik, Regan Hoffman, Baleigh Nachtigal, Briana DeGroot - 4x100m relay; Taylor Schrank, Braelyn Qualm, Tamya Mushitz, Addison DeVries - 4x400m relay; Lee Reiser, Shot Put and Discus - (state champion and school record holder); Jack Ringling - discus; Camden DuFrain - Pole Vault (broke school record-14'); Parker Bailey - Pole Vault; Aiden Bultje - 100m dash; Trevor Rolland - 200m dash; Skyler Hanten - 200m dash; Skyler Hanten, Trevor Rolland, Hayden Sprik, Aiden Bultje - 4x100m relay (state champs); Braxton Breukelman, Skyler Hanten, Trevor Rolland, Aiden Bultje - 4x200m relay (2nd).

Supt. Bailey congratulated the Platte-Geddes Golf Team and coaches for their qualification and performances at the state meet. Golfers qualifying for the state meet included: Mallory Gant, Presley Meyerink, Dawson Hoffman, Jadon Petersen, and Jye Bailey.

The Platte-Geddes Class of 2023 was congratulated and wished the best of luck.

Superintendent Report

The renovation project continues to progress. To date, the roof membrane on the elementary and high school buildings have been removed and replaced. The roof metal flashing/cap should begin on both roofs within the next two weeks. The footings and foundation walls have been completed and backfilled on the elementary addition. The underground plumbing for the addition has been completed and the foundation floor is in progress. Work will continue on the demoing of the existing unit ventilators and hydronic piping along with additional cutting of walls to make way for the installation of the ductwork, hydronic piping, and sprinkler piping.

The contractors have run into a few issues. They will need to readjust the 2nd floor air handler units #1 and #2 chase walls and south elementary classroom ceiling heights to accommodate new ductwork. Change orders will be issued. Supt. Bailey inquired about the additional change orders and reasoning for them. The majority the change orders will come from the high school due to age of the building, lack or original drawings, and changes made throughout the years that went undocumented. The change order for the chase

wall is a result of the location of the floor beam that could not be identified until the ceilings and floor were opened up (air handler #1). For air handler #2, the current wall is sitting on a beam that was previously cut into for previous duct work. The beam is not structurally sound, and the wall needs to be removed to replace the beam. This will now become the chase wall for ductwork to go from the first to the second floor.

State bid options for replacing the 2013 Dodge minivan and 2009 Ford Fusion have been looked into. Currently there are only two vehicles that would meet district needs and neither of them are great options. A Chevy Malibu for a base cost of \$22,530.00 and a Jeep Grand Cherokee for \$41,172.00 are being offered at this time. It would be ideal to replace the vehicles, but two minivans or one van and an SUV would be better options. Another option would be to solicits bids for lightly used low mileage vehicles. Core Coop does a combination of both and has been successful, however, they are primarily purchasing cars and not minivans or SUVs.

Previously, it was reported that the Board of Education Standards proposed changing the transcription of dual enrolled course credits at the high school level to one credit. The DOE is currently working through the rule change but has reached out to superintendents on whether they should proceed with the one credit requirement. Survey results showed that it is about a 50-50 split between districts offering one credit or a half-credit for a dual credit course. The DOE will be scheduling a meeting soon to hear from superintendents and make a final decision. The district's current practice is to give a student a half-credit for a dual-credit course.

Supt. Bailey and K. Holter collaborated to submit the Title I Consolidated Application, which is due on July 1. There are always revisions to be made, but they are usually minimal. The IDEA Flowthrough Application is due on July 3 and DOE Year End Checklist is due on June 16. These will be submitted for review next weeks.

Mrs. Knecht and Mr. Hunhoff will be attending the State Principals Conference on June 12-14. They both will be presenting breakout sessions, which allows them to attend the conference at no cost to the district. The admin team will be attending the Wild West Leadership Conference on June 14-16.

The search for a 5-12 Instrumental Music Teacher continues. Supt. Bailey has reached out to the neighboring districts to see if any would be interested in sharing a teacher, but that has not been fruitful. He has also reached out to NSU, SDSD, and USD to see if they had any student teachers that need to be placed this fall. A Zoom meeting was also held with a firm that places Filipino teachers in schools around the United States.

Mrs. Knecht is going to submit a Ralph and Francis Mitchell Grant application. The grant will be for a new underlayment for the playground area that would replace the flex fiber that is currently there. The ideal underlayment would be a poured rubber surface. The area is approximately 50x100, which would cost approximately \$50,000. With this grant, there is an expectation that the district would contribute additional funds to further complete the project (i.e-additional playground equipment).

Core Educational Cooperative Report

R. Summerville reported on the Core Educational Cooperative meeting held on June 8, 2023.

Approve Contract of Platte Colony Paraprofessional, Pamela Hallman

Mrs. Hallman brings seven years of paraprofessional experience to the district. The PG-ESP Master Agreement allows a new employee to bring in five years of experience. Ms. Hallman's contract will be for \$16.40, plus the special education differential. Motion D. Starr, seconded M. Petersen approving the contract of Mrs. Pamela Hallman as Platte Colony Paraprofessional at an hourly rate of \$16.40 plus the special education differential. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Amended Contract of Platte Colony Teacher, Ms. Samantha Ringling

The rural incentive for colony teachers was inadvertently omitted from Ms. Ringling's contract last month. She will be receiving an additional \$600.00 per year per the Certified Master Agreement. Motion M. Petersen, seconded D. Starr approving the amened contract of Ms. Samantha Ringling including the \$600.00 per year rural teacher incentive. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Hospital Discussion

After the May board meeting, Mark Burket reached out to individual board members and explained the exact scope of the proposed collaborative drainage project on the south end of the elementary playground. The board took no action at the May board meeting, but based on the potential meetings with Mark, the

item was put back on the agenda. Burket informed Superintendent Bailey that the hospital is proceeding by planning both ways and construction is scheduled to begin on June 26. If the board has changed their minds about the project, there is enough time between the board meeting and the start of construction to include the project. After discussion by the board and additional information shared by Mark Burket, not action was taken regarding the project.

Supplemental Budget

K. Holter presented information on the current budget and areas needed to be supplemented mainly due to increased grant allocations and mileage reimbursement rate increase. Motion D. Starr, seconded R. Varilek approving the adoption of the supplemental budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year. All members present voted aye. Motion carried. A copy of the supplemental budget is on file and available in the business office.

Approve Transfer from Capital Outlay to General Fund

Current projections indicated that the General Fund will deficit spend by approximately \$250,000.00. Motion D. Starr, seconded R. Varilek to transfer up to \$350,000.00 from the Capital Outlay Fund to the General Fund for FY23. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Child Nutrition Contract

The Dakota 11 Food Buying Group has awarded Performance Foodservice the food service contract for the 2023-2024 school year. Each member district of the Dakota 11 needs board approval to finalize the contract. A copy of the contract was included with the other board documents. This will be the districts first time working with Performance Foodservice. The district worked with Cash-Wa for several years. Motion D. Starr, seconded R. Summerville approving the Child Nutrition Contract with Performance Foodservice for the 2023-2024 school year. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Amend Policy DID, Inventories

GASB 96 requires districts to capitalize subscription-based information technology arrangements (i.e STAR360, IXL). It was recommended by auditors that school districts update their policies to include verbiage that sets the lease amount threshold. Subscription-based technology arrangements that fall under the threshold would not have to be capitalized per this policy (DID). It is recommended that the threshold amount be set at \$25,000. Motion R. Summerville, seconded D. DeBoer approving Policy DID as amended, adding verbiage setting a \$25,000.00 threshold for subscription-based information technology arrangements. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Elementary Teachers Computer Purchase

Mr. Neugebauer will be ordering new MacBook Air w/ M2 laptop computers for the elementary teachers. The unit price is \$979.00 and total order amount is \$24,475.00. Motion R. Varilek, seconded R. Summerville approving the purchase of elementary teacher computer at a total cost of \$24,475.00. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Change Order #2

Change order #2 has been issued to readjust the second floor air handler units and modify chase walls at the high school and south elementary classroom ceiling heights to accommodate new ductwork. Amount of Change Order #2 is \$43,579.00. Motion R. Varilek, seconded D. DeBoer approving Change Order #2. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.
