Petitioner's motion:

Move to reduce the Committee on Appropriations proposed school operating budget by \$500,000. This amount will bring the property tax increase below 2%, a level deserved by the taxpayers, particularly after the 8% increase last year. The school operating budget can be reduced by a cooperative effort of the school and municipal management teams. Both sides are well run, but neither is responsible for managing the bottom line that results in the property tax levy. They should set limits on increases then implement trade-offs and cost savings measures to achieve those limits. Instead of competing for resources, they should find ways to reduce cost through sharing of resources in areas such as finance, human resources, facilities, procurement and Information technology.
