

#### **Spring Highlights**

- **Bike Trek:** The third grade Bike Trek is back! The MMS third grade and fifth grade will follow a predetermined bike route through the town. Our fifth grade will participate in this event for the next two years, so they don't miss their experience.
- Cinco de Mayo: More than a quarter of our K-8 students and several staff members will
  take part in planning, singing, dancing, or producing our annual Cinco de Mayo
  celebration this May.
- Conferences and screenings: Spring conferences were held at the end of March/beginning of April; MMS Pre-K and kindergarten screenings will begin in May.
- Middle School Spring Student Activities: 56 student-athletes participate on MMS
   Athletic Teams in track, softball, and baseball; more than 20 6th-8th graders involved in
   MMS Drama will act or work backstage in two one-act productions for family and
   friends.
- Monmouth Music: Our MMS chorus students will sing the National Anthem at Hadlock field on March 22nd; we also will host a spring concert for grades 4-8 on May 25th.
- Read-a-Thon: Our PTO, supported by our 6th-8th grade Student Government, led a
  kickoff video and bookmark contest to begin our first Read-a-Thon fundraiser. This very
  successful fundraiser will bring a new Gaga pit for the MMS playground and support a
  number of student field trips.
- Robotics: Eight students (two teams) and two coaches representing our Vex Robotics team traveled to the 2022 Vex Robotics World Competition in Dallas, Texas this week.
   Between MMS and MA, 29 students in grades 7-12 participated in Vex during the regular season. 14 students in grades 4-8 participate in Lego Robotics.
- Spring Career Day and Touch a Truck: Students in all grades will participate in a
  variety of career-exploration activities, including traditional career-fair speakers for our
  middle school students as well as a number of hands-on activities for all.
- State Testing: End of year state testing in NWEA Reading, Mathematics, Language (Grades 3-8 only), and MEA Science (Grades 5 and 8 only) will take place in the month of May. MMS staff will participate in professional development this fall to learn more about how we can use our NWEA data to better inform instruction for students.
