Secretary of Board Report____

Mr. Bruchak stated the Business Office has been busy wrapping up the end of the calendar year. All W-2's are out and so are the 1099's. One of the items on the agenda this evening is the approval of the 2013-14 Preliminary Budget. The total expenditures on the preliminary budget are \$31,788,041. The preliminary budget was presented at the last Operations Committee. Administration is recommending the Board approve the preliminary budget that includes the Act 1 Index and to apply for exceptions that the district may qualify for.

Another item on the agenda is the approval of the 2013-14 LCCC budget. Their total operating budget is \$4,099,090, which is a 1% increase. The capital debt service and lease budget is \$2,391,067. Salisbury's share of the budget is \$232,328, which is a slight decrease of \$920 or 0.4%. These numbers are in the preliminary budget.

Mrs. Ziegler stated that a meeting was held last Wednesday and the middle school was highlighted. There were different stations of what the students were showcasing. Mrs. Ziegler stated the administration, parents and students did a job well done. Next year an advanced instrumental course will be added. Mr. Bobeck expressed concern about the language in paragraph 6 in the KidsPeace Pool Lease Agreement knowing that other groups also use the facility. The language reads, "In the event a lane line is damaged beyond normal wear and tear, Salisbury Township School District will be responsible to reimburse KidsPeace the costs associated in repairing the damaged lane line... Any equipment beyond the lane lines will be the responsibility of Salisbury Township School District." Mr. Bobeck expressed that the ownership should be shared with other organizations that use the facility. Mr. Bobeck also stated that another item not addressed in the agreement are the starting blocks. Attorney Freund suggested that he review the agreement and should be able to adjust the language. For tonight's motion to be approved the following wording should be added to Item B-4 "subject to solicitor approval." Mr. Roth said that there was also an issue with the touch pads, but the district purchased new ones and those are owned by the district. Mr. Mantz suggested that paragraph 11 also be reviewed since it discusses damages.

Salisbury's portion of this budget is \$232,328.00. (Board Information Item 14)

D. Lehigh Career and __Technical Institute_

Mr. Frankenfield stated he was unable to attend the LCTI board meeting, but he did attend Skills USA. Amanda Ferreira placed third in the health knowledge bowl.

E. PSBA Legislative
Policy Council

Gov. Tom Corbett presented his third budget proposal to the General Assembly, a \$28.4 billion state spending plan for 2013-14, which is a 2.4% increase over 2012-13. For preK-12 education, Corbett's budget plan means a \$90 million increase in the basic subsidy and funding for most other programs contained at current levels. The governor also called for major changes to the pension systems for state and school employees. The largest increase in the education budget once again is allocated to pensions. The budget includes \$1.08 billion, an increase of \$223.9 million, or 26.2%, for school employees' retirement costs.

Gov. Tom Corbett unveiled his plan for the privatization of liquor and wine sales, with the revenue from the auction of liquor licenses to be used for a proposed new "Passport for Learning" block grant that would provide \$1 billion to public schools over the next four years.

The House Republican Caucus recently unveiled a legislative package aimed at reforming charter and cyber charter school funding. The Charter and Cyber Charter Funding Reform Package will include components that would correct the pension double dip by allowing deductions for school district pension payments prior to calculating payments to cyber charter schools. Another piece of the package would make changes to the current cyber charter funding formula for non-special education students.

The House of Representatives approved HB 19, following earlier approval from the Appropriations Committee. The bill requires school districts to incorporate an age-appropriate child exploitation awareness education program into the existing curriculum for students in grades K-8.

The House Gaming Oversight Committee approved HB 290 which makes numerous changes to the Local Option Small Games of Chance Act. Among the various changes, HB 290 allows the Department of Revenue to approve small games of chance through regulation with statutory guidelines and clarifies that an entity operating solely in the public interest has the ability to retain the money for its own charitable purposes. The bill removes the requirement that only one license can be issued at a licensed premise and allows an organization to hold their small games at another organization's licensed premise and each organization can operate games at the same time.

The Senate Communications and Technology Committee amended and approved SB 114, which would require state agencies to provide notice of data breaches

involving personal information within one week.

Pursuant to Act 85 of 2012, the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) has published the list of low-achieving schools in which students, who live within the schools' boundaries, may be eligible to apply for a scholarship through the EITC 2.0 Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit Program. PDE's list of low-achieving schools contains 406 school buildings in 71 school districts across Pennsylvania.

HB 555 requires school districts that transport students to include a link to the Megan's Law website on any transportation-related communication to students, parents or the public.

HB 2 implements a new special education funding formula, establishing how any increases in the current special education appropriation are distributed using weighting factors based on category of disability.

Mr. Mantz asked how the state calculates how much a district is funded for special education. RB will get back to him on it. There is no formula and all districts receive the same amount the prior year. Mr. Roth stated a district receives a set amount of funding based on a formula purely on your numbers not the needs of the students. If a district has students that were above those costs a district could apply for contingency funds but those contingency funds have decreased significantly. Sen. Browne proposed to do it based on the actual cost for school districts to educate these students.

G. Superintendent

Mrs. Samide stated the elementary schools are implementing the common core math standards. Tests next year will not be common core standards, but will stay with the Pennsylvania standards for one more year. The elementary schools continue with the" Leader in Me" initiative. Western Salisbury Elementary is participating in a Lighthouse training in the Spring. Mr. Cassidy remarked that next Friday marks the mid-marking period at the middle school. Sixth grade are participating in the second step to a ten week guidance program which deals with decision making. The All-Stars program for seventh grade will also be taking place over the next 12 weeks. Both programs are free of charge. There has been an increase in participation numbers for history day. There are fifteen students this year. Only 5 participated last year. On March 23 the middle school will be having their 24 hour dance-a-thon to benefit cancer patients at LV Hospital. Ms. Morningstar stated that senior night for all sports was conducted last week. There were 100 people total who attended scheduling night. This is the first year course selection is available online via the parent/student portal; a pilot is being conducted with current 8th and 9th graders. Meghan Hrebik scored 1,000 points on her senior night at home court. Today a presentation was given by the district's attorney office on the dangers of sexting and how digital footprints are never deleted. Students responded well and the presentation was very beneficial. The Spring play is this weekend. Mrs. Fuini-Hetten stated that the high school and middle school represented the district at PETE & C. There are 12 students currently enrolled in VAST and the teachers are wrapping up professional development in the final model SAMR. Elementary report cards are being reviewed and the district is

looking at supplemental resources for professional development along with conducting summer academies. Dr. Ziegenfuss also mentioned the state technology conference, PETE & C, where the district was able to share our story. It was a great opportunity to connect with other schools. Jen Brinson, high school teacher, was a co-presenter with another teacher from Dubois School District.

Mr. Roth stated Anthony Dee has 96 wins in wrestling and will be going to districts. He also congratulated Mr. Barna on 500 wins with the Debate team. Mr. Roth met the student advisor teams at the elementary level. The students spoke of their love for technology and their teachers. The Western Salisbury students did ask for trampolines and soda. The high students advisory were asked to tell Mr. Roth what creativity is. From that conversation the district will probably have their first student blog/post. Mr. Roth stated there was an article in the newspaper regarding Southern Lehigh Superintendent Leah Christman, Southern Lehigh School Director William Hayes and himself met with State Representative Simmons and the House Education Committee to express concerns around the switch to PCG for ACCESS service dollars. It has been troublesome for many districts; millions of dollars are not getting into the hands of districts in a timely fashion. Representative Simmons called the meeting.

Mr. Giordano asked that an overview of the common core be presented at a curriculum meeting with examples to educate the community and School Board. Dr. Ziegenfuss replied that at the February meeting at Western Salisbury Elementary School the spotlight will be on the common core math that the elementary is doing.
