Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Complete multi-disciplinary evaluation components as determined appropriate by MDET chairperson and/or Special Education Director.
2. Prepare evaluation reports with interpretations and recommendations to the Eligibility and/or IEP team(s).
3. Establish and conduct a training program for improving the assessment competencies of special education teachers.
4. Review Individualized Educational Programs (IEPs) and provide staff development and technical assistance to special education teachers regarding IEP development.
5. Assist in the monitoring and compliance of special education screening and evaluation timelines.
6. Assist regular educators in data analysis and utilization in the referral process.
7. Design and maintain databases and spreadsheets for the collection, analysis, and reporting of data for compliance and accountability.
8. Assist with the development, implementation and monitoring of Special Education Improvement Plans as dictated by the Continuous Improvement Monitoring Process (CIMP).
9. Maintain the special education computer and assistive technology inventory and lending library.
10. Provide technical support to special educators regarding hardware and educational software.
11. Maintain professional work habits.
12. Demonstrate commitment to personal and professional development.
13. Promote and maintain good public and employee relations in all areas of responsibility.
14. Maintain and upgrade his or her professional skills.
15. Perform other professional tasks as assigned by the Director of Special Education.
