^{*}Board of Education Policy adopted June 26, 2013, regarding Career & Technical Education (CTE) & Differentiated Career & Technical Education (DCTE):

Applications will be made through the Parental Choice applications for all Career and Technical Education programs for students entering 9th or 10th grade in accordance with the application process. Acceptance into the Career and Technical Education programs will be based on a holistic approach with the primary indicator being the student's interest. An interest inventory will be required and available through O*NET Online (www.onetonline.org). The student's 7th & 8th grade attendance, grades, and behavior will also be evaluated holistically, but may not be used to preclude the student's admission into a Career and Technical Education program.

Additionally, all available seats in 9th and 10th grades will be filled and no student should be denied access due to secondary indictors if an opening exists.
