# Goal for Cherokee-Connect

# Why give a device?

As a part of the Strategic Plan call to Action all Cherokee learners will be fully equipped at every level to be responsible, well-rounded, global citizens. What does this mean to our students?

Technology is a part of our workplace. Schools are a safe place to walk alongside our students and train them on the good and bad of technology. We have the ability to filter and put systems in place that help train students and give them the tools and mindset they need. We are teaching them what it means to be a good digital citizen. This can include choices of what to do and when to do it. What a great opportunity to teach students in a school safe environment.

# Increased Student Engagement

- Students are more focused

# Devices

- P3-3rd Grade will have iPads.
- 4th-5th Grade will have Chromebooks.
  - Devices will not go home with students in P3 thru 5th Grade.
- 6th-12th Grade will have Chromebooks.
  - Students will be expected to take the chromebooks home and charge each night.

# Right Tool

Think of it as textbook, sometimes you use it and sometimes you don't.

Teachers determine what standard they are teaching and then identify what is the best tool to use.

# Google Apps



Google Apps for Education has become increasingly popular. This collection of programs allow students and teachers to collaborate easily on files, research and prepare presentations. These programs will be installed on all Chromebooks.

# Student Email

All students 4th thru 12th grade have a school email address.

[xxxx@cherokee.k12.ok.us](mailto:xxxx@cherokee.k12.ok.us)

Students in 4th thru 10th grade are only able to send/receive emails within our school network.

# Chromebook Login

- Device is managed so that only our Cherokee login will work.
- Only students enrolled at Cherokee will be able to use this device - no other logins will be accepted.



# Filter

- Whether devices are on or off campus, all our devices go through our Cherokee filter.
- We follow CIPA (Child Internet Protection Act) requirements for filtering.
- No matter how you access the internet, the chromebook will be using our filter!
- Students will NOT be able to access:
  - Social media - facebook, twitter, instagram
  - Netflix, Hulu, or other streaming sites
  - Inappropriate sites
- What is blocked at school, is blocked outside of school.

# Filter

We are using a program called GoGuardian to filter Chromebooks while they are on and off campus. GoGuardian will allow us to keep the Internet as open as possible—but as safe as necessary—with granular web and YouTube filtering, plus theft recovery, flagged activity alerts, and custom blacklists.

This program also has a teacher component that allows teachers to see what the students are doing while they are in their classroom. This allows teachers to manage classroom technology, guide their students towards the right information (at the right time), and encourage them along the way.

# Filter

GoGuardian allows Administration to see in realtime what students are searching for and sends automatic alerts if needed.

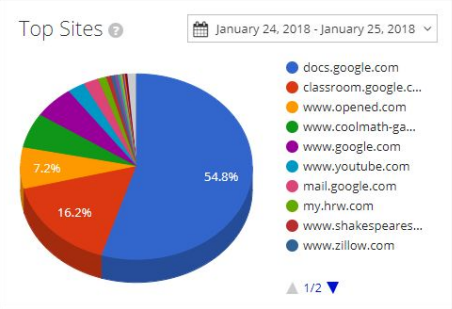

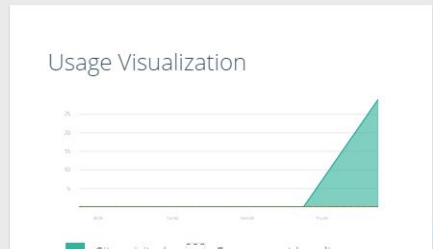

# Problems...Now What?

- Issues - report a problem by visiting the [Cherokee Website](#) or bring the device to the High School Library.
- Stolen Device - Contact Amanda Tucker at [tuckera@cherokee.k12.ok.us](mailto:tuckera@cherokee.k12.ok.us) to get the serial number. Once you have the serial number a police report needs to be made and a copy brought to the school.
- If the device is not working properly, a loner device will be given to the student

# Insurance Program

## Student Technology Insurance Program Grades 6 - 12 2017-2018 Policy

The Student Technology Insurance Program gives parents peace of mind through the ability to purchase insurance. The insurance package covers the repair/replacement costs of the Chromebook. The cost is only \$25. The policy will start the first day the device is checked out until August 2018. If the policy is not repurchased before the start of the 2018/2019 school year the coverage will end the last day of summer 2018.

The insurance program is voluntary, but families are highly encouraged to participate. If insurance is not purchased at the time of device acceptance, parents/guardians are responsible for the full cost of any repair/replacement of all damage to loss of the Chromebook, case and charge cord. The following fee schedule will apply:

### Typical NON-INSURED Repair/Replacement Costs:

Chromebook (Complete)	\$230
Charge Cord	\$30
Screen	\$65
Wi-Fi Card	\$30
Keyboard	\$60
Touchpad	\$30
Battery	\$60
Motherboard	\$95
Hinges	\$15
Top Cover	\$20
Bottom Cover	\$20
Replacement Case	\$60
Charging Port	\$90

Acts of intentional damage will not be covered by insurance and the insurance policy is voided.

### Insurance Coverage:

If purchased, the CPS Student Technology Insurance Program covers 100% of the **FIRST** incident of damage or loss (including theft\*\*) of the Chromebook; 50% of the **SECOND** incident of damage or loss (including theft\*\*) of the Chromebook from date of issue through start of following school year (e.g. Student is covered from start of 9th grade year insurance through start of 10th grade year when insurance is offered again beginning of 10th grade year). On the **THIRD** incident, the parent is responsible for all repair/replacement costs. Exact repair/replacement costs will be determined at

100% - 1st Incident

50% - 2nd Incident

0% - 3rd Incident

An incident is defined as any damage, loss or stolen device, case or power cord. Coverage restarts at the beginning of each school year.

\*In some circumstances fees may be waived, Principals will be the ones to make this determination.
