#### **Locations (Sites)**

#### Who We Serve

All K-8th grade youth in the Wautoma Area School District service area can enroll. *Includes homeschool, online and private schools.* Priority is given to:

- Previously enrolled youth and their siblings
- Youth that can attend 4 or more days per week on average
- Youth identified by teachers as needing extra services
- Youth that would benefit by participating in the program

#### **Program Activities**

A+ offers a variety of activities daily:

- Enrichment Activities (Academic, STEM, Art, Physical Activity, and Life Skills)
- Homework Help and Tutoring
- Snack
- Recreation
- Free Choice Activities

Other activities and events offered:

- Field Trips
- Family Events
- Adult Enrichment Opportunities

#### **A+ Team Members**

- 34 paid part-time employees including:
  - •WASD Teachers and Aides
  - •Parents and Grandparents
  - Professional Community MembersHigh School Students
- 41 volunteers
- 13 Organizations provided free programming and services for A+.



# History of the A+ Program

In 2000 a group of community members, parents and district staff recognized the need for an after school program in Wautoma. A+ has grown over the years from primarily homework and a safe place to be to include enrichment, youth voice and leadership opportunities, tutoring, field trips, parent education, quarterly celebrations, competitions and community involvement.


#### **ENROLLMENT & ATTENDANCE:**

- 21% of K-8 students in the WASD enrolled (202 youth)
- 134 students attended A+ each day on average
- 93% were regular attendees (30+ days)
- On average, regular attendees attended 112 days of A+
- 47% of regular attendees attended 120 days or more!

#### **DEMOGRAPHICS OF REGULAR ATTENDEES:**



#### Parkside's 21st Century Community Learning Center (CCLC) Grant Objective Results for 2018-19:

#### Academic Goals:

At least 65% of RA (regular attendees) will meet or exceed their targeted growth score (35 SGP) on the STAR Math & Reading Assessment from Fall 2018 to Spring 2019

- Reading: 65% met or exceeded their growth goal
- Math: 69% met or exceeded their growth goal

At least 50% of RA that warrant improvement in completing homework to the teacher's satisfaction and academic performance will show improvement per the Spring Teacher Survey.

At least 70% of RA (regular attendees) will meet or exceed their individual growth goal in Math and Reading/Early Literacy, based on STAR tests in Spring 2019.

- Reading/Early Literacy: 67% met or exceeded their growth goal
- *Math: 64% met or exceeded their growth goal*





- 2018-19 Program Fees: \$45/quarter, \$150/year
- Cost to participants: \$1/day or \$.40/hour (2.5 hrs/day)
- <u>Actual cost per student per day:</u> \$10.71 (based on average attendance)
- The Reach the Peak Fundraiser (sponsored by Thrivent Financial & ThedaCare) provided \$4,150 in scholarships for 59 youth to enroll in A+ this past year, \$3,750 for an Afterschool AmeriCorps Member to support students during school and after school, as well as scholarships for summer camp and spring break.
