### **Check Engine** Light - What's The **Problem?**

When your check engine lights comes on your first thought is, what's going on? Okay, that's the clean version, maybe you think or say something a little worse. The check engine light comes on when your vehicle's computer detects a problem with the emissions or drivetrain. It could be as simple as a loose gas cap or as severe as an engine failure. Don't ignore it, get is diagnosed as soon as possible. A flashing check engine light indicates a more serious problem and needs immediate attention. Below you'll find a list of the five most common reasons that pesky check engine light comes on.

Number 1 – Oxygen sensor needs replacement. Roughly \$250

Number 2 – Catalytic converter needs replacement. \$1,300

Number 3 – Ignition coil and spark plugs need replacement. Roughly \$400

Number 4 – Fuel cap is not tight. Roughly \$25


