Out of District or Requesting Another School for Next Year?

February is the month to apply for a transfer to a school that is not the school assigned by your address. If you reside outside the Marysville School District, you must apply for attendance

To apply for an Out-of-District waiver, you need to go to your home school district office and apply there. This is called a "Choice Transfer".

You may pick up an Annual In-District request form at the office. Remember that February is the best month to complete these documents as it is the "Annual In-District Transfer Month".

Bus Pass Procedures:

If your student is going home on a bus with a friend, or getting off at a stop that is not their usual stop, a parent or guardian must send a note with your student on the day that they will ride the bus. The student will then need to bring the note to the office to have a bus pass issued for them.

Bus drivers will not allow students on a bus that is not their normal bus, nor will they allow students to get off at a stop that is not their regular one without a pass.



If your student will be met at their stop by someone other than their usual adult, please notify transportation at (360) 965-0300. This is especially important for our Kindergarten and Special Needs students.



Getting Ready for School:

priate bus behavior.

- Have your children put everything they carry in a backpack or school bag so that they won't drop things along the way.
- Encourage them to wear bright, contrasting colors so they will be more easily seen by drivers.
- Make sure children leave home on time so they can arrive at the bus stop before it is due. Ideally at least five minutes early. Running after or in front of a bus is dangerous.
