

Dear Parents and Guardians,

On Monday, LCC and schools and banks across the country are closed, and community events are taking place to honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., one of the most important African-American leaders in U.S. history. As one of the iconic figures of the civil rights movement in the United States during the 1950s and 1960s, King's fight against discrimination and segregation changed American history and gave hope to millions for an absence of inequality and oppression in the future.

On August 28, 1963, King gave his iconic "I Have a Dream" speech where he stated, "I have a dream that my four children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character."

Pope Francis noted the importance of King's dream, one that continues to inspire Americans and people from around the world to this day: "I think of the march which Martin Luther King led from Selma to Montgomery fifty years ago as part of the campaign to fulfill his 'dream' of full civil and political rights for African Americans. That dream continues to inspire us all. I am happy that America continues to be, for many, a land of 'dreams.' Dreams which lead to action, to participation, to commitment. Dreams which awaken what is deepest and truest in the life of a people."

Celebrating the life and legacy of Dr. King is important. Perhaps students could use part of the day to perform service. Although we still have much work to do to achieve the racial equality that King spoke of and dreamed about, Pope Francis reminds us not to lose hope: "Building a nation calls us to recognize that we must constantly relate to others, rejecting a mindset of hostility in order to adopt one of reciprocal subsidiarity, in a constant effort to do our best. I am confident that we can do this."




### **Caprella and Evans receive Award**
