Dear Parents and Guardians,

This week our SOS group, with the help of our guidance department, coordinated Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) week. Throughout the week, students were challenged to help each other, the school and the community through various activities. Do you recall the last time someone was kind to you? When was the last time you were kind to someone else? Think about their reaction and how that made you feel. I have to believe that no one has performed an act of kindness and then regretted it, in part because of the way we are left feeling upon completing the act.

While I believe kindness and happiness are linked, the difference is that happiness is passive and kindness is active. We live in an increasingly virtual world, where we isolate and compare ourselves to others. We spend time looking at our phones and devices and avoid contact with people, which can make us unhappy and lonely. People - teenagers in particular - are searching for something fulfilling. Posters have been made and, hopefully, in the near future I will be able to report the success of their efforts, rooted in love and kindness.

It isn't coincidental that Valentine's Day is embedded in RAK week. Loving others is not always easy. It takes effort and courage. It takes action. Start with yourself. Say something kind to yourself. Recognize the good in yourself so that you have more to give others. Kindness has been a tenet of our faith. It shouldn't just be part of a dedicated week or marketing plan. It has to be part of who we are all, even when the messages of the world say otherwise.

RAK Week Day 4 - Take what you need. Students grabbed positive messages off the board.






American Math Competition
