

School District of Wild Rose (SDWR)
Infectious Disease - Back to School Plan
August 8, 2022

If a person tests positive, we highly encourage them to report the Positive Covid-19 Test Result to the County Public Health as well as the School District for Department of Public Instruction (DPI) and Federal Education Reporting.

Goals/Priorities

- Safe Educational Environment
- In person 5 days/week learning format
- Limit stress/disruption for students, staff, and parents
- Communicate quickly, appropriately, and respectfully

Face Coverings / Masks

The School District of Wild Rose will recommend, but not require persons to wear masks in district buildings.

*It is highly recommended, but not required, that persons with any symptoms wear a mask.

Learning Platforms

- 100% In Person - 5 days/week
- If a student is isolated or quarantined, posting of materials and assignments will be through a virtual/remote option
- A live full-time virtual option will not be available.

Communication

- We have partnered with our Website Provider (Apptegy) to contract the ROOMS service to increase communication between home and school

COVID-19 Positive (Isolation)

- Person Tests Positive
 - Stay at home for 5 days
 - After 5 days
 - Return to school if you are symptom-free for 24 hours
 - Recommended to wear a mask for 5 additional days
 - If you have a fever, continue to stay home until the fever resolves

Students will be asked to stay home if they have one or more symptoms in column A and two or more symptoms from column B.

Symptoms Chart	
1 Symptom / Column A	2 Symptoms / Column B
Fever greater than 100.0 F New Loss of Taste/Smell Cough - New/Uncontrolled Shortness of Breath Difficulty Breathing	Muscle or Body Aches Congestion or Runny Nose Fatigue Sore Throat Chills Headache Diarrhea Vomiting

Close Contact (Quarantine)

- Students, Staff, and Visitors may come to school as long as they are symptom-free for 24 hours.

District Contact Tracing

- When necessary, District contact tracing will be administered by members of administration, school nurse, or County Health Department

Cleaning and Sanitation

- Frequent cleaning of common surfaces and spaces
- Hand sanitizer stations
- Try to maintain social distancing whenever possible

Other Information

- Both the Wild Rose Elementary and Middle/High School use the online registration process for continuing students entering grades K-12
- During the school year, families who are new to the School District are asked to please register your students at their school of attendance as soon as possible. When registering, it is important that you provide an original birth certificate (for viewing purposes only) and proof of residency (rent receipt, lease, utility bill, etc.). Parents are also asked to bring along their children's immunization records.
- Teachers may return furniture/carpets to rooms
- There will be no limit to the number of spectators at events
- Field trips will occur as approved by administration
- SDWR will provide COVID-19 testing for students or staff through the state-sponsored testing program
- The free federal government-sponsored food service program has ended

After School Program

- Our goal is to start the After School Program on September 12, 2022

COVID-19 Infection Control and Mitigation

- Reminder: No one should enter a SDWR facility and/or vehicle if they are ill, have symptoms related to COVID-19, or have been in close contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19
- Reminder: It is essential that parents provide accurate Emergency Contacts when registering their children for school and continue to keep us updated with any changes

Ventilation:

- Per recommendation from the Waushara County Emergency Management, we will have our outside airflow into the building set at 20% or greater and we will run our HVAC fans to maintain high air exchange

What should I do if my child is ill, has symptoms related to COVID-19, or has been exposed to someone with COVID-19?

- Please keep your child(ren) home, contact their respective schools immediately, and provide the school with a list of symptoms so this information can be provided to the school nurse to provide assistance to families as needed

What will happen if a student becomes ill while at school?

- Each school will have a Wellness Room where an ill student can safely rest while waiting for the arrival of their parent or guardian
- A staff member will provide the child with a facial covering if they are not currently wearing one
- Parents or guardians will be contacted immediately - **It is essential that we have emergency contact information for each student**
- School staff will encourage the parents to contact their medical provider

Final Statements

Visitors who have tested positive MUST REFRAIN from entering the schools or attending school events (Athletics, Parent/Teacher Conferences, Open House, Field Trips, etc.)

School, local, state, or federal officials can make changes to this document at any time. If any changes are made, the public/community will be notified. This may include, but is not limited to, closing a classroom, school, or building and required Virtual Live Instruction and/or required masking of students and staff.
