POLICY OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION


SICK LEAVE FOR SUPPORT PERSONNEL


Sick leave days will vest on employee's reporting date.

Said sick leave will be cumulative to a total of sixty days.



Year 1988-89

Unused Accumulated Sick Leave

Upon termination of tenured employment, either by retirement,
uncontrolled illness, ^{*or death} certified employees, ^{*or beneficiary} shall receive a lump
sum payment equal to their own accumulated and unused sick leave
at the rate of thirty (30.00) dollars per day. Once a certified
employee has reached the maximum accumulated (120) one hundred
twenty sick days for the I-18 school district, the certified
employee will be paid a lump sum payment for each unaccumulated
sick day at the rate of thirty dollars per day. This payment
shall be made at the close of each school year.

ATTENDANCE OFFICER AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into between Independent School District #18, Ottawa County, Oklahoma through its Board of Education, and the City of Commerce Police Department.

This agreement is made pursuant to 70 O.S. Sec. 10-102.1 and 10-109 which authorizes agreements between school districts and local police departments to allow the department to detain and take temporary custody of students absent from home and school during school hours without a valid excuse. The terms of the agreement are as follows:

1. The Commerce Police Department will temporarily detain and assume temporary custody of any child subject to compulsory education laws who is, during hours in which school is in session, found away from the child's home and absent without valid excuse from schools of the Commerce District.

2.
