


STUDENT CONDUCT DRESS CODE


The Board of Education believes that the majority of the students in the public schools recognize their own individuality and have no need to express themselves in extreme dress or grooming styles. Generally, dress and grooming standards as determined by the students and their parents will not be questioned. The only requirements the board of education insists upon are that students' dress and grooming shall not lead school officials to reasonably believe that such dress or grooming will disrupt, interfere with, or detract from school activities, or create a health or other hazard or other hazard to the student's safety or to the safety of others.

The superintendent is directed to establish a regulation supporting this policy.







STUDENT CONDUCT DRESS CODE (REGULATION)

In accordance with the policy of the board of education, the following regulation shall establish a dress and grooming code for the public school system.

Generally, students should regard neatness and cleanliness in grooming and clothing as important. Dress or grooming which is in any way disruptive to the operation of the school will not be permitted.

Revealing or sexually provocative clothing, or clothing of extreme style may not be worn. Pants or shorts will be worn at or above the point of the hips. All fasteners designed for use with an article of clothing will be used at all times with the exception of the top button on the collar.

Principals, in conjunction with sponsors, coaches, or other persons in charge of extracurricular activities, may regulate dress and grooming of students who participate in a particular activity if the principal reasonably believes that the student's dress or grooming creates a hazard, or may prevent, interfere with, or adversely affect the purpose, direction, or effort required for the activity to achieve its goals. Athletic participants must abide by the rules and regulations of the OSSAA. Formal attire is appropriate for formal occasions such as coronations and proms.

If a student's dress or grooming is objectionable under the above provisions, the principal shall request the student to make appropriate corrections. If the student declines, the principal shall notify the student's parent or legal guardian and request that person to make the necessary correction. If both the student and parent or legal guardian refuse, the principal shall take appropriate disciplinary action. Any class time the student misses to change clothing will be counted as an unexcused tardy or absence.


Students who violate provisions of the dress code and who refuse to correct the violation may be disciplined by removal or exclusion from extracurricular activities. In extreme cases, students may be suspended until the violation is corrected.

The following are specifically prohibited:


1. Cutoffs, short-shorts, boxer shorts, bike shorts, tube tops, halters, tops with spaghetti straps (during regular school hours), mini skirts, body suits, bandannas, over sized belts, chains, saggy pants, or other similar items will not be permitted by boys or girls.

2. Shirts or blouses that do not overlap their skirts or trousers. Shirts should cover the chest.
3. Clothing with writing or pictures which are suggestive or symbolic of drugs, alcohol, sex, or anything obscene, vulgar, illegal or immoral. (No Big Johnson or Co-Ed Naked Shirts)
4. Gang related items
5. Body piercing (exception: ear piercing)
6. No under garments should show regardless of current fashion.
7. Because of the destructive nature, no metal cleats or taps will be permitted on boots or shoes.
8. No hats or caps of any kind may be worn in the school building by male or female.


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



Present policy in the Student-Parent Handbook

STUDENT APPEARANCE

Students will be expected to keep themselves well-groomed and neatly dressed at all times. Any form of dress or hair style which is considered contrary to good hygiene or which is distractive or disruptive in appearance and detrimental to the purpose of conduct of the school will not be permitted. Students may wear walking shorts or jams. Cut-offs, short-shorts, boxer shorts, bike shorts, tube tops, tank tops, halters, mini skirts, body suits, bandannas, over sized belts, chains, baggy pants, or other similar items of clothing will not be permitted by boys or girls. Pants or shorts will be worn at or above the point of the hips. Shirts advertising alcoholic beverages, or those with obscene or questionable printing (No Big Johnson or Co-ed Naked Shirts) on them will not be permitted. All fasteners designed for use with an article of clothing will be used at all times with the exception of the top button on the collar. Because of their destructive nature, no metal cleats or taps will be permitted on boots or shoes. No hats or caps of any type may be worn in the school building by male or female.

Any class time the student misses to change clothing will be counted as an unexcused tardy or absence.
