

REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

COMMERCE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

AUGUST 4, 1986

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Reed presented a budget in the amount of \$1,979,897 for SY 1986-87. Motion was made by Terry Helmig to accept the budget as presented. Second was made by Gene Hulsey. Vote: Helmig yes, Hulsey yes, Moudy yes, Perry yes.

Mr. Currey gave a report to the Board on maintenance items for the summer. Mr. Currey also asked the Board to consider requiring all vocational students at the vocational school to ride the bus that is provided by the Vo-Tech school.
