

## Parents Make A Difference!

This month we will take a quick look at Senate Bill 346. Gov. Mary Fallin signed this bill (referred to as the "law to end social promotion") into law almost two years ago and is scheduled to go into effect starting with next years' third graders.

As a result, Oklahoma now requires students that entered the second grade this year to master grade-appropriate reading skills by the end of third grade in order to be promoted to the fourth grade. The mandate directs schools to identify reading deficiency's early and if necessary to retain students before they reach the third grade.

School districts are now required to notify parents that their child has a reading deficiency and that the student would be held back if the deficiency is not improved. Public schools would be required to develop a plan to work with parents to help their child read.

The law does state that no student can be held back more than twice; a student held back twice and still found to lack necessary reading skills at the end of the third grade would be promoted to the fourth grade but would receive additional reading assistance.

The bill also comes with an extensive list of measures that schools must take to get failing students back on grade level before the end of the year so they won't be held back, and a number of practices the next year to make certain they aren't held back again. Cont. Col 2
