Juniors will take the ASVAB

The Junior class will be taking the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Batter or ASVAB test on Tuesday, January 13, 2004 beginning at 8:20 am. This test will be administered by the military. All juniors are required to take this test. They receive information in the test results to help them make career decisions.

The ASVAB is a multi-aptitude test battery. It helps identify the different skills and competencies of each student. It consists of eight short individual tests covering General Science, Arithmetic Reasoning, Word Knowledge, Paragraph Comprehension, Mathematics Knowledge, Electronics Information, Auto and Shop information, and Mechanical Comprehension.

Students will get results in three career exploration areas: Verbal Skills, Math Skills, and Science and Technology Skills. They may not be interested in a career with the military, but this information may lead them to the perfect career choice for them.

Commerce students are encouraged to look at their career options seriously and to make a choice.



#### **Basketball Homecoming Queen**


