



Tulsa State Fair Eligible members will be able to attend the Tulsa State Fair for a \$2.00 admission on Oct. 7th.








BLUE AND GOLD SAUSAGE SALES BEGIN





Tigers Fall to No. 1 Pawnee

After a heart-breaking loss last year to the Chouteau Wildcats, the Tigers overcame a slow start to demolish their opponents.

In the 2nd quarter, the Tigers added 3 yard runs by both Logan Cawyer and James Sullivan; the Tigers went in the locker-room at half with a nice lead of 40-0. With evident class, the Tigers would only score once more, with James Sullivan taking it in from 19 yards out. He also finished with 10 tackles, and was trailed by a large swarm of Tigers who had a great night defensively too. Brock Vanatta, Chance Coats, and Kyle Long all had 6 take-downs apiece and Airam Delarosa and Greg Thomas both with four each. The Tigers ended the game with another goose-egg in their 47-0 victory against the Salina Wildcats.

The Tigers came into Week Three with big hopes of proving that they could compete for the coveted Gold-Ball, and were very impressive in a first half battle, but fell short in the second half to lose by a score of 53-18. With the Tigers scoring on a Chance Coats 29 yard pass from Klint Reading in the first drive, everything was looking up. Unfortunately, the Jones Brothers soon lived up to the talk that had been circling, as Gerald Jones took off for 64 yards as soon as he touched the ball for the first time. The Tigers would hold the the Black Bears to only 20 offensive points in the first half. With 2 scores of 4 and 5 yard passes from Klint Reading to Damyon Dooley, the Tigers would play up to their high expectations and the score would have been 20-18 at the half, but the Black Bears' Gerard Jones ran back a fumble recovery for a TD. The Tigers would not score again. With no steam left, the Tigers just could not stop Jones as he would score on runs of 64, 55, 87, and 42 yards. Adding scores from Gerard Jones of 10 and 4 yards, the Tigers were just outmanned as they fell to the Black Bears with a score of 53-18.

Tigers Overcome Adversity to Dominate District Championship Battle

Everyone was wondering how the Tigers would bounce back from their devastating loss to Pawnee, and the Tigers would come to play. With the Oklahoma Union Cougars coming to town, there were many speculations about how the Tigers would react to the situation. The Cougars came out keying on Tyler Williams, which opened up the playing field for some other Tigers. The Tigers would score twice in the first quarter, on a 21 yard pass to Damyon Dooley and a Klint Reading 33 yard romp. With Logan Cawyer kicking a 25 yard field goal and also catching a 34 yard toss, the Tigers would take a 24-0 lead at the end of the half. The Cougars' only score would come in the third quarter, but would be answered right back with a 65 yard gallop by Klint Reading. Reading, Dooley, and Cawyer all had great games; Klint finished with 12 carries for 105 yards and also passing just under 50% completion with 78 yards and two TD's, Logan with 62 yards and Tim Osborn ended the game with 63. The Tigers showed great class and surprised the Cougars with a 31-6 victory as the Tigers moved to 1-0 in District play.
