Valedictorian and Salutatorian Named

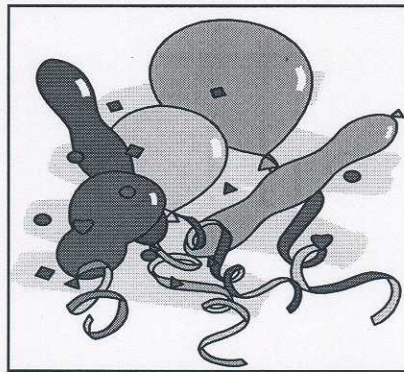
