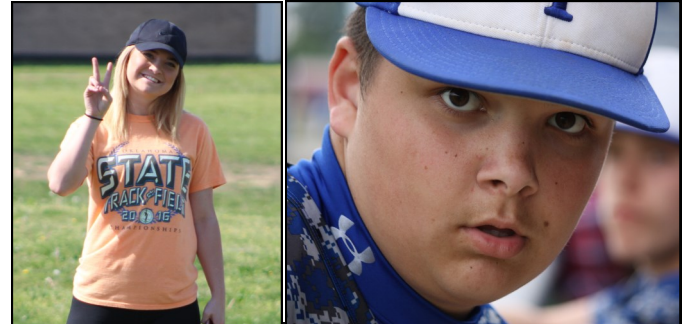

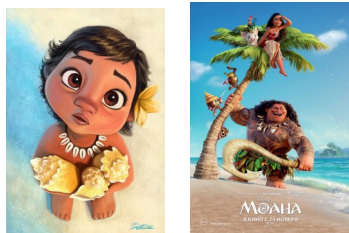

How to SAFELY Drive in the Rain:

- 1. Be road ready.** Ensure that the vehicle's tires have enough air pressure and tread depth, and replace windshield wipers when needed. Use headlights in rainy or overcast conditions. If possible, avoid driving during heavy thunderstorms.
- 2. Don't rush.** Reduce speed by one-third on wet roads, and increase to three-second following distance. Avoid hard braking and sharp turns – rainy conditions make it harder to see and stop for pedestrians and animals.
- 3. Precaution.** Prevent hydroplaning (when tires lose contact with the road) by easing off the gas pedal until the vehicle regains traction, and by turning the steering wheel in the direction of the skid.
- 4. Test the brakes.** Passing through deep water may saturate brakes. Drive slowly while braking lightly before building up speed again.
- 5. Get scuba gear.**

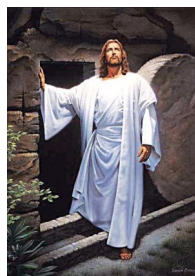
